**NARRATIVE:**

On 02/05/21, while patrol with the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Traffic Enforcement Unit, I overheard that Deputy S. A. Woodworth #1469 was out on a traffic stop out on Alvernon Way and Aviation Parkway and requested a backup unit. Shortly afterward, Deputy D. F. Mosman #6723 had arrived to help him out. I then overheard via the radio that they both been out with two males that were being detained.

I went to go assist. In doing so, I learned that the two males that were being detained had been found in the back of the pickup truck in the bed and that the driver of the pickup truck could not be identified at that time being that he did not have an identification on him. Also that the driver of the pickup truck was a Spanish-speaker.

I went over and spoke with the male and introduced myself to him. I asked him for his information. He gave me his information of [REDACTED]. Upon looking through records, I could not locate him. I asked if he had any identification on him. He informed me he did not. He informed me he had a Mexican driver's license, but he did not have it on him. The female passenger also stated that he had a Mexican driver's license, but he left it at home. At that point, I was not able to confirm his identity, I did several searches for his name. I ultimately found he had previous contact with the PCSD, but did not have a driver's license or any formal identification.

The United States Border Patrol arrived on scene. They interviewed the two males that were in the back of the pickup truck as well as Mr. [REDACTED]. When doing so, Border Patrol determined that they would be taking all three males with them being that they did not have any type of documentation to show their legal status in the United States.

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I saw that Mobile Maintenance and Towing (MM&T) arrived on scene and took possession of the vehicle being that the driver of the vehicle did not have his driver's license, I did a tow form for that. Once MM&T cleared from the area as well as Border Patrol agents, I saw Deputy Woodworth gave the female by the name of [REDACTED] a ride to her residence. I then cleared from the area.

This concludes my involvement to this case.

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**SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:**

Initial Case Narrative by S. A. Woodworth #1469 on 02/06/21 at 0158 hrs.

On 02/05/21, at approximately 2158 hours, I was on patrol in the San Xavier District driving northbound on Alvernon from Ajo. In the lane next to me, I observed a blue GMC lifted pickup truck with no mud flaps. I had been overtaking the vehicle and was intending to make the next exit at Alvernon. I observed the vehicle now behind me move from the number two lane to the number three lane behind me with its high beams on.

As I got to the bottom of the off ramp, I moved to the right hand lane and slowed down quite a bit in an attempt to allow the pickup truck to overtake me so I could make a traffic stop on it; however, as I got to the bottom, I lost sight of the vehicle where there was nowhere to turn off. I pulled off on the next opening in the curve. I sat there and waited about 10 seconds for the truck to keep coming down the street driving very slowly. I pulled in behind it and observed that it was bearing an Arizona license plate that I initially thought was [REDACTED]. Later, I determined that the license plate was partially covered by a ball hitch. The actual license plate was [REDACTED].

I initiated my emergency equipment and made a traffic stop on the truck at Alvernon just past Aviation. At this time, it was driving about 20 miles per hour. I walked up and made contact with the driver and a front seat passenger. I identified myself as Deputy S. A. Woodworth #1469 with the Sheriff's Department and asked to see his license, registration and proof of insurance. The driver explained to me that he did not speak English and that he only spoke Spanish. I requested the items again in Spanish.

The front seat passenger explained to me that the driver left his license in his other car. I asked what license he had. She told me that his license is a Sonoran Mexico license. She provided me with her Arizona driver's license identifying herself as [REDACTED] (DOB \*\*\*\*\*). The male verbally identified himself as [REDACTED] (DOB \*\*\*\*\*). In doing a records check, I could not locate anyone with that name. Later, it was determined that his last name was [REDACTED].

While I was speaking with Mr. [REDACTED] and Ms. [REDACTED], I asked if there were two people lying down in the back of the truck being very still. I said hi to them and they looked as though they were trying to ignore me. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] and Ms. [REDACTED] about the people in the back. They looked immediately surprised, jumped up and looked out the back window of the pickup truck into the bed. She explained to me that they did not know who those people

were. I requested a backup unit.

A short while later, Deputy D. F. Mosman #6723 arrived.

Due to the fact that Mr. [REDACTED] and Ms. [REDACTED] had no idea who the people were in the back of their truck, Deputy Mosman and I detained both of the individuals as they were trespassing in the vehicle. I placed the subject I recovered out of the back of the truck into handcuffs, which were double-locked behind his back. I then escorted him to my patrol vehicle. I conducted a search of his person. He told me that he had some identification in his wallet and I retrieved that, which was what looked like some sort of school identification card from Mexico. I placed him in my patrol vehicle. Deputy Mosman placed the subject who he detained in his patrol vehicle. I requested Border Patrol.

Deputy J. Rodriguez #5818 arrived on scene and was able to speak with the two people in the back. They had two different stories. One was that they got into the truck with permission and one was saying that they got into the truck without the knowledge of the driver and passenger.

Due to the fact that Mr. [REDACTED] does not have a driver's license and cannot prove that he has ever had a driver's license, the vehicle was going to be immobilized. Deputy Rodriguez completed the tow sheet.

Border Patrol Agent Pang #T481 interviewed the two subjects who were in the bed of the truck, as well as Mr. [REDACTED], and elected to detain all three and take custody of them. Ms. [REDACTED] was provided with information regarding the tow of the pickup truck.

Mr. [REDACTED] received a citation for Driving Without a License, Failure to Dim High Beams and Driving Without Mud Flaps. He signed his citation promising to appear and was issued his copy before going with Agent Pang.

This concludes my involvement.

On 02/05/21, at approximately 2255 hours, I was requested as a backup unit to Deputy S. A. Woodworth #1469 at Aviation and Alvernon.

Once I arrived on scene, Deputy Woodworth informed me there were two individuals in the bed of the vehicle and the driver and occupant of the vehicle do not know who they are. Those two individuals were then taken into custody.

I took one individual into custody who was laying on the passenger's side of the vehicle. Deputy Woodworth took the other individual into custody. They both spoke Spanish. My individual tried to speak with me, but I was unable to communicate with him because of the language barrier. He was placed into handcuffs, double-locked for security, and then placed in the backseat of my patrol vehicle until we were able to identify him.

Deputy Woodworth started Border Patrol, who eventually arrived on scene. I stood by as scene security while Deputy Woodworth and later Deputy J. N. Rodriguez #5818 arrived on scene.

Border Patrol took custody of my individual and then I was no longer needed on scene.

On 02/07/21 at approximately 1727 hours, I responded to a call in reference to an assist other agency at North Ajo Gila Bend Highway and West Mead Road.

The call text stated that the caller, identified as [REDACTED], was advising that a male asked him to call Immigration. Border Patrol was notified and asked if we could stand by with the subject. The closest agent was south of town. Additionally, the call text stated that Border Patrol estimated a 30 minute response time.

Upon my arrival to the incident location, I observed there to be a truck with a fifth wheel camper being pulled. It was parked off the north side of Mead Road at the intersection of Mead and Arizona 85. I additionally observed there to be a Hispanic male, who I identified via his Sonora, Mexico, driver's license as [REDACTED]

( DOB \*\*\*\*\*

He was standing next to the truck and had a camouflage backpack which was similar in color to a pattern typically used by undocumented aliens.

Upon approaching the two, I made contact with [REDACTED]. He told me that the individual standing next to him had waved him down and asked him to call Immigration.

In basic Spanish, I asked [REDACTED] if he spoke English. He stated he did not, only Spanish. I then asked him in Spanish if he required water or if he was hurt. He replied neither.

After gathering [REDACTED]'s information, I told him he was okay to leave the scene.

I stood by with Anderson until the arrival of Deputy D. Hardwick #8877, who, being fluid in Spanish, conversed with [REDACTED]. Please see his report for further details. However, as Deputy Hardwick was conversing with [REDACTED], I noticed [REDACTED] pull a Gatorade bottle with water out of his backpack and attempt to drink it before pouring it out. Due to this, I retrieved a container of water from my vehicle and filled his Gatorade bottle for him.

After standing by for a few moments, Border Patrol agents arrived on scene, being Agent E. Maldonado, Badge #A32, and Agent M. Boyd, Badge #A131068. The agents took custody of [REDACTED]. Deputy Hardwick and I then cleared the scene, concluding my involvement in this matter.

The following item was submitted as safe keeping at the Green Valley District Office on 03/07/21 at approximately 0350 hours. The item was secured in Locker #004.

- \* JC-5 - QTY 1 Hat device

**NARRATIVE:**

On 03/06/21, at approximately 2246 hours, as I was northbound on Interstate 19 from Sahuarita Road, I observed a gold in color Lincoln four door sedan bearing Arizona license plate # [REDACTED]. I observed that one of the license plate lamps were out. The plate was clearly not visible within about 50 feet of the vehicle. I also noted that the vehicle was operating just at or slightly below the posted speed limit. The vehicle was traveling in the number two lane.

As the vehicle approached Pima Mine Road, I initiated my overhead emergency equipment. The vehicle exited off of Interstate 19 using northbound off-ramp onto Pima Mine Road just about 200 feet shy of Pima Mine Road. The vehicle yielded to the shoulder. It was at this time that I observed that the vehicle was occupied by one subject.

As I proceeded up to the passenger's side of the vehicle, I came in contact with a male subject verbally identifying himself to me as [REDACTED]  
( DOB \*\*\*\*\*

As I asked [REDACTED] for his driver's license, vehicle registration, and proof of insurance, [REDACTED] was unable to provide me with a driver's license stating that he did not have one. As well, [REDACTED] was unable to provide me with any sort of proof of financial responsibility for the vehicle. [REDACTED] was, however, able to provide me with a registration card, which he produced from the glove compartment of the vehicle.

As I proceeded back to my patrol vehicle, I conducted a driver's license information query along with a wants and warrants check. This produced an Arizona Crime Information Center (ACIC) return indicating the existence of an arrest warrant for Albert out of Tucson City Court. At that time, I contacted Communications and requested that a backup unit respond to my location.

I once again exited from my patrol vehicle, proceeding up to the driver's side where I again made contact with [REDACTED]. I directed [REDACTED] to exit from the vehicle. I directed [REDACTED] to the front of my patrol vehicle where I secured [REDACTED] into handcuffs while also engaging the double-locking mechanism. I informed [REDACTED] that he was being detained for a possible warrant out of Tucson City Court. [REDACTED] responded by informing me that the warrant was old.

As I asked [REDACTED] if he had any illegal substances on his person, [REDACTED] denied having such items. [REDACTED] consented to a search of his person. As I conducted the search of [REDACTED] person, I retrieved a "tooter" straw from [REDACTED] right back pocket. The "tooter" straw appeared to have burnt residue inside. [REDACTED] informed me that he used Oxycodone to which he did not have a prescription for and utilized the "tooter" to smoke and ingest the Oxycodone.

NOTE: During this time, Deputy M. J. Aragon #6701 had arrived on scene.

As I had retrieved the "tooter" from [REDACTED] person and after [REDACTED] identified the "tooter" straw as a "tooter" without being prompted to do so, I retrieved my department-issued Miranda Rights Card from my pocket. I read the Admonition of Rights verbatim from that Miranda Rights Card. Under Miranda, [REDACTED] agreed to proceed with further questioning.

Under Miranda, I, again, asked [REDACTED] to tell me what the straw specifically was used for. Once again, [REDACTED] admitted to utilizing the "tooter" straw to smoke and further ingest the Oxycodone into his system.



As [REDACTED] had consented to a search of the vehicle, Deputy Aragon advised me that he had located a canister containing what appeared to be prescription medication along with a syringe that was found contained inside of a backpack.

[REDACTED] admitted to ownership of the backpack. [REDACTED] further advised me that he used the syringe in order to clean the "tooter" straw. I informed [REDACTED] that he would be charged with Possession of a Narcotic along with Possession of Drug Paraphernalia on top of being served the warrant out of Tucson City Court.

As the warrant was confirmed valid by Communications, I informed [REDACTED] that he was under arrest. I secured [REDACTED] into the prisoner compartment of my patrol vehicle with the seatbelt fastened. As I was closing the door, I was alerted by Deputy Aragon to what appeared to be two male subjects lying in the trunk of [REDACTED] vehicle. I observed that Deputy Aragon had his pistol drawn and was pointing the pistol at any unknown threats.

After securing the door of my patrol vehicle and ensuring that [REDACTED] was secured inside, I then went to where Deputy Aragon was holding on the male subjects in the trunk of the vehicle. I as well drew my department-issued pistol, pointing it at any unknown threats. As Deputy Aragon had advised that he had located bullets inside the vehicle, it was unknown if any of these subjects had firearms. I was also unable to see any of the subjects' hands.

As I advised Communications of the situation, additional units from Sahuarita Police Department (SPD) began to arrive on scene. As additional units arrived, I holstered my pistol and went hands-on with both subjects, assisting each subject out of the trunk of the vehicle, and securing each subject into handcuffs with the double-locking mechanisms engaged.

Both subjects were identified as undocumented aliens. I recognized camouflaged clothing found in the trunk of the vehicle. It was through my training and experience that this camouflaged clothing is regularly routinely worn by undocumented aliens as they migrate into the United States. The undocumented aliens were later identified by Border Patrol as [REDACTED] (DOB \*\*\*\*\*) and [REDACTED].

After handcuffing both subjects, I directed both undocumented subjects to have a seat between my patrol vehicle and the defendant's vehicle. I contacted Communications and requested that Border Patrol respond.

While at the scene, Deputy Aragon took several photographs of the area, to include the defendant's vehicle as well as the items of paraphernalia and

medication. I also further directed Deputy Aragon to photograph both undocumented subjects. Please refer to Deputy Aragon's supplemental case report for further details.

As the pills and syringe as well as the "tooter" had been photographed, I retained these items in my possession throughout my custody of [REDACTED]

As Border Patrol arrived on scene, Border Patrol took custody of both undocumented subjects.

Notifications were made to the on-duty supervisor, Sergeant C. O. Enderle #6708.

As it was determined that [REDACTED] would be booked into the Pima County Adult Detention Center and would not be taken into custody by United States Border Patrol (USBP), I transported [REDACTED] to the Pima County Adult Detention Center in Tucson where custody of [REDACTED] to include his property, were then transferred from me to that of Corrections staff.

A hat device located on the bill of [REDACTED] hat was provided to me from Corrections staff. It was explained to me that the hat device would not be allowed to be placed into [REDACTED] property. The hat device was then transferred to my custody to be placed into safe keeping as that was what [REDACTED] had wished for me to do. At that time, I retained the hat device in my possession, later placing the hat device into safe keeping at the Green Valley District Office.

Deputy Aragon remained on scene and completed a Vehicle Removal Report (VRR) as well as stood by as the vehicle was removed from the area. Please refer to Deputy Aragon's supplemental report for further details.

NOTE: I observed a half-eaten hot dog in the center console in the vehicle next to where the defendant, [REDACTED] had been operating the vehicle. [REDACTED] had on his person at the time of arrest three mustard packs. As [REDACTED] had, at one time, expressed that he was unaware of the documented persons in the trunk of his vehicle, I also observed the same hot dogs to be associated with the undocumented people. [REDACTED] in particular, was clutching a half-eaten hot dog at the time [REDACTED] was detained.

It was due to the fact that [REDACTED] had the subjects being transported in the trunk instead of in the actual passenger compartment of the vehicle that I charged [REDACTED] with ARS 13-1201A, Endangerment, a Class 1 Misdemeanor. As the Oxycodone Hydrochloride had been listed as a narcotic drug defined under ARS 13-3401, I charged [REDACTED] with Possession of a Narcotic drug along with Possession of Drug Paraphernalia for the syringe and "tooter" found to contain

burnt residue.

**NARRATIVE:**

On 03/06/21, at 2302 hours, I responded to Deputy J. M. Creel's #8117 call of a traffic stop he had conducted on Pima Mine Road and Interstate 19 for a backup deputy.

I arrived on scene a few minutes later. The driver, later identified as [REDACTED] was being taken out of the vehicle and handcuffs were being applied on him reference a warrant out of the Tucson Police Department (TPD).

I was given consent, which I heard, from Mr. [REDACTED] to search the vehicle, which was a gold Lincoln LS with Arizona license plate # [REDACTED]. While checking the vehicle in its interior, I was searching the backseat of the Lincoln. I observed a Puma backpack directly behind the driver's seat. Upon searching the contents of the backpack, I observed the personal use of marijuana, what appeared to be a pipe, an unused syringe, and some .22 caliber bullets.

I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if the backpack was his. He stated that it was either his or his brother's, but then stated that the Puma backpack was his. I asked what he used the syringe for. He used the syringe to clean out his "tooter".

Upon continuing checking the backpack, I then observed a cylinder container about approximately three inches, at which time I unscrewed it and observed what appeared to be a pain medication that appeared to be a prescribed medication without a prescription. I asked the kind of medication it was to Mr. [REDACTED]. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he did not know what medication I was referring to. I stated the ones that had the little "M" symbol inside the cylinder. He stated he did not know who it belonged to.

During this time, Communications radioed Deputy Creel that the warrant as confirmed. At this point, Deputy Creel stated that he one in custody and at this point placed Mr. [REDACTED] in his patrol vehicle.

As I was finishing up the search, I heard what appeared to be bumping coming



from the rear of the vehicle. At this point, I was unaware what the noise was being caused from. I went back to the driver's side door and pressed the unlock for the trunk, at which time it popped open. I started walking towards the trunk and was on the driver's side of the trunk when it was open. I observed two moving bodies in the truck. I then unholstered my duty weapon and, at this time, made several announcements to Deputy Creel as well as the individuals to stay where they were at. I had my gun drawn on them. Deputy Creel also, at this point, unholstered and we had both subjects at bay.

Deputy Creel and I called for additional officers to arrive on scene. Sahuarita Police Department (SPD) were the first units to assist us. SPD and I were using lethal threat and at which time each individual was taken out one at a time by Deputy Creel. Handcuffs were placed behind their back.

At first, it appeared to be three individuals in the back of the trunk, but after further investigation, there were only two male individuals who were in the trunk. The trunk was searched for any weapons, which none were located.

At this point, Border Patrol was contacted as well as a sergeant from the San Xavier District was also contacted in reference our stop.

At this point, I maintained scene security. Border Patrol arrived about a half an hour later and given a synopsis of what had occurred, they took over the investigation in reference the undocumented aliens.

I was informed by Deputy Creel that the driver was suspended and due to it, we were taking possession of the vehicle because he had not had issued a driver's license. I radioed Communications to start a tow truck to our scene. Deputy Creel, at this point, took Mr. [REDACTED] into custody and transported him to the Pima County Adult Detention Center.

I filled out the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Vehicle Removal Report (VRR) and conducted an inventory. This consisted of a cell phone, miscellaneous clothes, no United States currency, the black Puma backpack, the personal use of marijuana was left in the vehicle due to the recreational marijuana being legal now, the Wildcat .22 bullets, miscellaneous paper, and a pocket knife were documented into the inventory.

At 0030 hours, the wrecker from Mobile Maintenance and Towing (MM&T) arrived. The keys were given to the tow truck driver and he signed his copy of the VRR. He was given his copies. After his copies were given, I then later cleared the scene.

Later, I returned to the Green Valley District Office and submitted the photographs into the Digital Imaging Management System (DIMS).

At this time, this concluded my involvement in this report. For initial report, please reference to Deputy Creel's report reference the initial case.

On 03/07/21 at 1957 hours, while on patrol I was dispatched to Arizona State Highway 85 at Milepost #44 in reference to a suspicious person.

The call text stated there was a male wearing a white shirt going southbound, and he was kind of on the road. An ambulance almost hit him.

Upon arrival to the location of incident Sergeant K. N. Gabriel #7323 and I were the first to arrive on scene.

Sergeant Gabriel attempted to talk to the male, but he advised he only spoke Spanish. Due to being able to speak Spanish, I was able to communicate with the male.

He told me he had been walking through the desert for approximately five days and he had crossed the border from Mexico into the United States. He was initially with a group, but he advised approximately two days ago while they were walking in the desert Border Patrol had made contact with them and he had run away, and got separated from his group. He told me he continued to walk until he was able to find his way to Arizona State Highway 85. He stated he was very tired and was waiting for Border Patrol to come pick him up and take him back to Mexico. He stated he travelled with a bag, but he got tired of carrying the bag and just decided to leave the bag behind.

The male we made contact with was later identified as [REDACTED] via his Mexican identification card.

Once [REDACTED] advised he was in the United States illegally and he was from Mexico, I requested Communications have Border Patrol meet me at my location.

I advised [REDACTED] that Border Patrol would be on their way shortly.

I stood by as scene security and waited for Border Patrol to arrive. Once Border Patrol arrived on scene, they advised they would take custody of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] was escorted to the Border Patrol vehicle.

Initial Case Narrative by M. V. Horrigan #8878 on 04/24/21 at 1149 hrs.

Total Dictation Time = 21:20 mins.

On 04/24/21, at approximately 0452 hours, I was patrolling the intersection of Arizona Highway 85 and Rasmussen. During my patrol of the area, I identified a vehicle traveling northbound from my south at a high rate of speed. As the vehicle passed me, it slowed down a bit, but it was traveling at approximately 42 miles per hour (MPH) in a 35 MPH.

I proceeded to follow the vehicle northbound and identified numerous odd behaviors from the vehicle as well as civil infractions. Numerous times it proceeded to veer off the right of the fog line as well as swerved several times across the center line. As it began to go northbound, I was able to pace the vehicle approximately 65 MPH in a 55 MPH. This was after I was using my radar to clock it going the 45 MPH in a 35 MPH. Both pace and radar were used in my analysis of the speed which the radar was tuned prior to shift using my 30 MPH tuning fork as I always do prior to my shift.

As the vehicle approached the intersection of Arizona Highway 85 and Schwartz Road, I proceeded to engage in a traffic stop on the vehicle. After calling out the plates to Communications, they returned back to me prior to my vehicle coming to a stop a little bit north of Arizona Highway 85 and Schwartz Road, that the vehicle was in fact stolen out Phoenix, Arizona.

As vehicle my approached a stop directly behind it, Deputy S. Khamseh #8061 flanked my vehicle to the right which was also on the east side of the highway. Once both vehicles were in position, we proceeded to engage in a high risk maneuver stop on the white sport utility vehicle (SUV) that I identified as the traffic stop was engaged. It was a 2004 white GMC Yukon.

As we proceeded to engage in a high risk traffic stop, we gave loud verbal commands to the driver to step out of the vehicle. When instructed to remove the keys from the ignition, the driver was unable to present the keys through the driver's side window which was very suspicious at the time. We requested the individual place the keys on top of the vehicle, which he did not do.

After having the individual whom we identified later as [REDACTED] exit the vehicle and proceed to walk backward toward my patrol vehicle, I removed myself from the driver's side position and placed myself directly behind Deputy Khamseh on the passenger's side where I proceeded to engage [REDACTED] with my handcuffs after he was instructed to remain in a kneeling position. I handcuffed Mr. [REDACTED] and double-locked my handcuffs with my quick locking mechanism as I

always do for tightness and comfort and proceeded to escort Mr. [REDACTED] to the rear passenger's seat of my vehicle. I did a quick Terry frisk to acknowledge any weapons that may be on Mr. [REDACTED] and I was unable to find anything in the immediate vicinity of Terry frisk, I then placed him in the back rear side of my patrol vehicle. It was at that time, I requested Mr. [REDACTED] let me know how many other individuals were in the vehicle. He explained to me that there were two females and a small child in the vehicle.

I returned to my position at the driver's side door and he continued loud, verbal commands to the individuals. Over several minutes without response from the individuals inside the vehicle and without any stimulus, Mr. [REDACTED] made an utterance that the individuals inside the vehicle do not know English. I began to shout in Spanish: Please open the door. After numerous minutes, we did not hear any stimulus or see anybody else at the vehicle. I proceeded to go on to my intercom and over the intercom tell the individuals to open the passenger door. After several attempts, the passenger's door was opened and a woman exited the vehicle. We instructed her to come to our vicinity via Spanish and we were able to take her into quick custody. The two other individuals which was another young woman and a small child exited the vehicle soon after leaving both the passenger's door and the rear passenger's door open. After taking all three into custody and placing them in handcuffs and securing them for comfort and tightness, we proceed to place all three who seemed emotional at the rear of Deputy Khamseh's vehicle for the time being. They stood by with another deputy as Deputy Khamseh and I cleared the remaining vehicle from the east.

After making sure the vehicle was safe and everything was secured, we proceeded to give Communications the clear for the vehicle. As we returned back to the patrol vehicles, we were able to identify the three individuals who exited the vehicles after Mr. [REDACTED] to be undocumented aliens due to their interactions with ourselves and from prior experience. We immediately relieved them of the handcuffs we placed on them and requested they sit in the back of the vehicle due to the cold climate and to make sure they were safe for the time being. We also asked them if they needed any water, food or blankets in the meantime. Their Spanish was very hard to understand and it seemed to have a different dialect than the typical Spanish which was heard so close to the border in Ajo. It was at that time, we requested a Border Patrol agent meet us at our location to help us with the investigation and help the individuals from the vehicle. We verified they were in okay standing and did not need any medical attention and proceed them with a safe shelter for the time being.

It was at that point, I returned to Mr. [REDACTED] and post Miranda did a recorded interview. Please see Digital Imaging Management System (DIMS) for the recorded interview. This is a synopsis of my interaction with Mr. [REDACTED]

I was able to identify Mr. [REDACTED] by the identification that was found in his pocket. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] what was going on. He explained that two individuals approached him when he was on 27th Avenue in Phoenix, Arizona. He stated that these two Hispanic individuals who were short and stalky in nature, nothing extraordinary about their appearance, approached him with the white GMC and requested them along with giving him \$100 and a Global Positioning System (GPS) imprinted on the GPS unit and pick up the three individuals who were apparently his sister-in-law, his wife and his son, who had not eaten for five days and had been wandering the desert. He stated that he wanted to help out of the kindness of his heart.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated the two individuals did not promise him anything else than the \$100 that they presented to him at the time of the confrontation. He proceed to then leave Phoenix at approximately 1000 hours and drove southbound to the location that was apparently placed into the GPS unit. I did not find a GPS unit in the vehicle whatsoever and the phone that was in the cup holder of the vehicle did not have a GPS running on it.

Mr. [REDACTED] explained that the found the two individuals between Ajo and the Border Patrol station. He did not go more south than Why. He then picked the three individuals up and proceeded northbound. He stated he was in a hurry and wanted to give the individuals food so he stated he stopped at the Circle K prior to picking the individuals up; however, I did not see anything that was bought or could produce evidence that he had stopped at the Circle K in the vehicle.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he had no idea the vehicle was stolen and he had no idea of anything that was in the vehicle. He stated there was a pipe in the vehicle and pointed out the exact location of it which was in the center console. Please see DIMS for documentation of that. He also stated that there was a military style bag in the rear seat that contained toiletries and other items that were also in the vehicle when he got it.

I asked where the vehicle's keys were. Mr. [REDACTED] explained to me that a screwdriver was what was used to start and stop the vehicle. I asked him numerous times was it odd that the vehicle did not have keys when he got. He stated he thought nothing of it. He stated numerous times that he wanted to help these individuals and that was why he decided to help the two who approached him in Phoenix. He did not have a name or anything besides the phone and the two individuals instructed him to park at the ampm on 27th Avenue once he had picked up the individuals and to leave the vehicle and the three individuals there. This was all post Miranda as I stated before.

Once I concluded my recorded interview with Mr. [REDACTED] I returned back to the vehicle to document the pipe which resembled a methamphetamine pipe which had burnt dark brown/black residue in the bowl. I was identified the Army style back which Mr. [REDACTED] pointed out. Inside were small baggies consistent with packaging for a small amount of drugs. I also found a toolbox in the back of the GMC that had five or so different cell phones, different shapes, sizes and brands, all appeared to be dead on battery. Besides that, I found numerous children's toys in the vehicle along with some clothing. I found one other camouflage bag that was consistent with a bag that undocumented aliens often take when they cross the border. They had toiletries, small amounts of food, some fruit and another change of clothes.

It was at that point that Border Patrol arrived on scene and attempted to help translate for me the conversation between me and the three other individuals, the two females and the young boy; however, due to the dialect that was apparently Peruvian from the statements the Border Patrol agent made, we were unable to get a complete story except that they were picked up south of Ajo. It was at that point, we made sure that the undocumented aliens were treated appropriately and that they had enough subsistence, comfort, and need to be then transported by Border Patrol to their station.

Border Patrol soon after conducted an investigation and documentation left the scene. It was at approximately 0526 hours, I requested a tow for the vehicle. I made sure to document all necessary findings of the stolen vehicle as confirmed it with Communications. The vehicle came back confirmed from Communications prior to the tow truck arriving on scene.

I released all paraphernalia from the vehicle as well as documenting the screwdriver. In moving the vehicle, I was able to identify the screwdriver fit perfectly in the wedge point of the GMC and it was the only way to turn the vehicle on that I found in the vehicle during my search of it. I proceeded to then close up all doors due to the fact that I no longer had any evidentiary value of the vehicle. The tow truck arrived on scene at approximately 0551 hours.

I also made contact with the registered owner, [REDACTED], in Phoenix, Arizona, and informed him that his stolen vehicle which was reported earlier on 04/23/21 had been recovered in Ajo, Arizona. I gave him all relevant information as far as the case number, the towing company, the towing phone number, as well as the location to pick up his recovered vehicle. It was at this point, he thanked me for calling him and stated he would come get the vehicle in the next day or so.



Once the tow truck left the scene, I then transported Mr. [REDACTED] to the Ajo District Office and proceeded to inform him he was going to be cited for three separate charges of Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Speeding, as well as Theft - Means of Transportation.

NOTE: Prior to Border Patrol leaving the scene, I made contact and advised Sergeant R. M. O'Connor #6322 of the circumstances of the investigation. He proceeded to inform me of a few other items that needed to be addressed during my investigation. I proceeded to do so and complete my investigation under the advisement of the Auto Theft Unit. This advisory was made prior to Border Patrol leaving the scene and prior to the tow truck arriving on scene.

I also advised Detective L. R. Bejarano #6702 as soon as I arrived at the Ajo District Office of the case.

As I arrived at the Ajo District Office, I had Mr. [REDACTED] exit the vehicle. Prior to giving over custody of Mr. [REDACTED] to the Corrections staff, I searched him incident to arrest. I found one item of note on his belongings was a green straw in his front left pocket, often referred to as a "tooter," which was often used to smoke different substances after being burnt on tinfoil. All monies, identifications, and debit cards were released to the Corrections staff, which did leave sight of Mr. [REDACTED] of any point in time prior to entering the facility.

After placing Mr. [REDACTED] in the custody of the Corrections staff, I proceeded to make all other notifications and complete all other necessary paperwork. I contacted Terminal Operations. I received Verification #228 from Badge #7551 and completed all necessary advisories and paperwork. I placed Evidence Item #MH1 through #MH3 in Locker Box #2, which included one green tooter, one glass pipe, and designated screw driver for the ignition.

After placing all evidence and making all advisories, as well as completing all citations, felony interims, and providing them for the Corrections staff at the Ajo District Office, I proceeded to clear the scene.

This concludes my involvement in the investigation.

At approximately 0430 hours, on 04/24/21, I became aware of the fact that Deputy M. V. Horrigan #8878 was going to initiate a traffic stop on a vehicle that was a white in color Chevrolet Tahoe that was traveling northbound on Arizona Highway 85. At this time, I decided to follow Deputy Horrigan as a backup unit.

Based on my personal knowledge as well as my observations in this area, this was the first time I observed this vehicle in this area during the early morning concluding that the entire town was closed at that time and also the border was shut down so it was very odd to see that vehicle that I never any contact with and never saw them in town driving at that time of the day. As a result, I decided to back up Deputy Horrigan as a precautionary measure.

Once Deputy Horrigan called out the traffic stop, the vehicle came to a stop at Arizona Highway 85 and Schwartz Road. I flanked Deputy Horrigan's patrol car from the right side and we came to a complete stop at the east portion of Arizona Highway 85. Once coming to a complete stop, we were advised by Ajo Communications that deputies shall use caution because the vehicle was returning as a stolen vehicle out of Phoenix Police Department.

At this time, I withdrew my handgun from the holster to hold the vehicle at gunpoint and I began to start giving commands to the driver to turn off the vehicle and keep his hands out of the window and directed him to step out of the vehicle. The driver was given orders to walk back towards us until he was given orders to stop. Once the driver walked back toward Deputy Horrigan's vehicle and my patrol vehicle, I continued to hold the vehicle in a lethal cover and have Deputy Horrigan place the driver in handcuffs. The driver was a Hispanic male subject with a facial tattoo.

Once Deputy Horrigan placed this driver in the back of his patrol car, I continued to give numerous commands to the occupants of the vehicle. Prior to Deputy Horrigan placing the driver in the back of his patrol car, we asked the driver if there were any occupants in the car to which he indicated there were two females and one child in the car. At this time, we started giving numerous commands to the occupants of the vehicle one by one to step out of the car. The occupants did not step out of the vehicle; however, we continued to hold the vehicle at gunpoint and we continuously gave the commands to the occupants.

After approximately three or four minutes of using the public address system of the patrol vehicle to loudly give the commands to the occupants of the car and

also shouting and yelling and identifying ourselves as Pima County Sheriff's deputies and directing the occupants and passengers to step out of the vehicle, finally the front door was opened and we observed a Hispanic female step out of the vehicle. It appeared that the Hispanic female had difficulty in understanding us. It appeared that she did not understand English; however, we attempted to direct her with broken Spanish to walk back towards us. Once the female walked back toward us, we secured her in handcuffs and placed her in the back of the patrol vehicle.

The vehicle was still a threat to us and we were not sure how many individuals were still in the vehicle. We continued to give commands to the remaining occupants of the vehicle. After giving several commands, ultimately a door was opened and it was observed that a Hispanic female with what appeared to be a seven or eight year old male minor stepped out of the vehicle. Both of these individuals were crying and they were saying stuff in Spanish which we did not understand.

At this time, once they stepped out of the vehicle we observed the camouflage as well as carpet shoes fell from them and fell on the ground. At that time, I believed these individuals were undocumented aliens. At this time, I was giving commands in a manner to not really intimidate them by using my hand to calmly tell them to walk back toward us. The female subject as well as the child started walking toward the sound of my voice until they were facing me and they stood right by my patrol vehicle front driver's side tire and started crying.

It was still unknown to me what was going on inside of the vehicle and if there were any occupants or if there were any armed persons in the car considering the vehicle was a stolen vehicle and I did not want to have the female subject right between myself and the vehicle. As I was giving her commands, she wasn't coming toward the sound of my voice. I did not want to make this position to be a "crossfire" considering that I suspected there might be an armed and dangerous person in the stolen vehicle and I did not want that person to pop out of the vehicle and start shooting at me and this female subject was right between me and the shooter in the vehicle as stolen vehicle recovery was considered a very dangerous situation.

At this point, I approached the female subject and grabbed her by her left hand and I walked her back toward my vehicle so I had her safely covered behind my patrol car as Deputy F. Rovi Jr. #1188 helped the male minor to walk back toward my vehicle. At this time, these individuals were secured in the back of my patrol vehicle.

At which point, we continued with challenging the vehicle and then Deputy

Horrigan and I proceeded to flank from the right side of the vehicle and clear the car. Once the vehicle was cleared, we holstered our firearms and I returned to my patrol vehicle. Considering that these individuals were undocumented aliens and the vehicle was already cleared, we had them step out of the vehicle and removed their handcuffs. These individuals were crying. We offered them water and soda; however, they continued to cry.

At that time of the day, the temperature in the town of Ajo was pretty low and it appeared they were shaking due to low temperature of the weather. At this time with broken Spanish we offered them to sit back in my patrol vehicle since it was warmer in my patrol car to which they agreed. At no time were these individuals in handcuffs after the vehicle was cleared. They were simply placed back in my patrol vehicle since they were complaining that they were cold.

The United States Border Patrol agents were requested to respond to our location via the radio. Once the agents responded they conducted an immigration inspection of these individuals and they determined that the two females as well as the male minor were in fact illegal aliens and Border Patrol agents transported these three individuals from the scene. However, the driver of the vehicle was later arrested and brought to the Ajo Jail by Deputy Horrigan for multiple charges. For further detail reference this matter, please refer to Deputy Horrigan's report.

On 04/28/21, at approximately 1710 hours, while conducting traffic enforcement in the town of Ajo, Arizona in Pima County, I observed there to be a silver, Toyota minivan heading northbound on Arizona 85 near North Second Avenue and West Clymer Street. I observed that vehicle to have what looked like a dream catcher hanging from the review mirror obstructing the driver's view and the vehicle was also following approximately half of a car length behind a large, black pickup truck. For those reasons I decided to conduct a traffic stop on that vehicle.

I activated my emergency lights and chirped my siren in the vicinity of North Second Avenue and West Fifth Street and the vehicle pulled over immediately. I approached on the passenger's side of the vehicle and in the rear seat of the van I observed there to be several water bottles, which were painted black, and had baling twine lanyards wrapped around them. I then knew those, through my experience, to be commonly associated with illegal immigration as they helped to deter detection from federal immigration agents. I additionally observed there to be several camouflage backpacks, which I also knew through my experience to be associated with illegal immigration as well.

As I made contact with the driver and passenger, I requested both of their Arizona state driver's license, which they provided to me. As I was collecting those documents, I observed a blanket over the furthest rear seat of the vehicle to be moving with what looked like a person in a fetal position lying sideways underneath it. At that time I shouted, "Policia, manos arriba," and I observed four sets of hands to raise from the vehicle from both rows of seats.

I retreated to my patrol vehicle and the driver and passenger to step out and brought them back towards my patrol vehicle. As I could see the hands of the rear passengers and had full control over the driver and passenger, I waited until a backup had arrived.

As I was waiting with the driver and passenger, an unidentified ranger from the National Parks Service stopped out with me until additional deputies arrived. Once they arrived, he departed the stop.

Once additional deputies arrived, we separated the driver and passenger with Deputy Hernandez taking the passenger back to her car with the driver remaining at my car while I conducted an interview about the traffic stop. Deputy J. Alvarez #8718 removed all of the additional occupants from the vehicle and we



requested, via radio, that Dispatch contact Border Patrol to arrive on scene.

I began interviewing the driver and as I was doing so, I observed her to be wearing a necklace with Santa Muerte, which I knew through my training and experience to be the patron saint of smugglers. Upon asking her about that, she stated she was a follower of Santa Muerte, but did not wear an idol of narco trafficking.

I continued my interview with the driver and she stated she had gone to Rocky Point with her friend who she had known for approximately three years. She additionally indicated she was Flagstaff and that her friend was from Peoria. There were inconsistent statements between the driver and passenger when Deputy Hernandez and I compared notes.

Due to my training and experience, I recognized that the story the driver had given me, which was that the suspected illegal immigrants had just in front of her car, at which time she stopped and picked them up out of compassion for their suffering to be false.

I continued interviewing the driver about her trip while I completed an Arizona Traffic Citation for ARS28-959.01B, Obstructed View, and ARS28-730A, Following Too Closely. I issued the driver, later identified as [REDACTED] the traffic citation at which time Border Patrol arrived and took custody of the driver, passenger and all the other occupants of the vehicle.

On 04/28/21, at approximately 1717 hours, while on patrol I heard on the radio Deputy W. Sheirer #8965 asking for a backup unit at his traffic stop location. Upon arrival to the location of incident, I made contact with Deputy Sheirer, who had made a traffic stop on a vehicle. He advised that there were possibly undocumented immigrants in the vehicle, which he described that they were dressed in all camouflage and he currently had a female out of the vehicle who advised she was the driver of the vehicle. She was later identified as [REDACTED]. Please see Deputy Sheirer's report for probable cause for the stop and getting the driver out of the vehicle.

Due to Deputy Sheirer speaking to the female, I then approached the vehicle from the passenger's side of the vehicle and had noticed multiple subjects in the backseat of the vehicle dressed in all camouflage and attempted to duck in between the seats to not be seen. The passenger's side window was already rolled down and I advised all subjects to show me their hands. All subjects immediately raised their hands and none of the subjects had any weapons that I was able to see in their hands.

At that time, I was able to get onto the driver's side of the vehicle and open the sliding back door of the vehicle because it was a van. When I opened the vehicle, I noticed multiple Camel backpacks and black water jugs in the backseat. Each subject I had come out of the vehicle with their hands up, which every subject that was in the back of the vehicle had given me consent to search their person. No contraband was located on their person.

At that time, I had each of them sit on the floor and cross their feet. When I got all the subjects out of the vehicle, I asked Communications to have Border Patrol proceed to our location. Later Deputy G. Maynes #9012 and Deputy N. Hernandez #9008 arrived on scene, which Deputy Hernandez stood by as scene security with a male passenger who was later identified as [REDACTED]. When I had spoken to [REDACTED] who was separated from [REDACTED] he was immediately read his Miranda Warnings and advised he did not want to speak with me. No further questioning was asked of [REDACTED]. Deputy Hernandez was then requested to stand by as scene security with him.

I then proceeded to speak to [REDACTED] whom I confirmed from Deputy Sheirer that she was Mirandized. I asked her where she was going or what had happened. She advised that they were on their way to Rocky Point and she had seen these people on the side of the road. She began to tear up and cry and said she felt bad for

them and advised them to get in the vehicle and they were going to find them some food.

I was later advised by Deputy Maynes and Deputy Hernandez that they had noticed the same vehicle traveling northbound from the Lukeville port of entry and had turned off to a parking lot when they were behind them. [REDACTED] continued to cry and I asked her for consent to search the vehicle, which she gave me consent. I noticed that [REDACTED] had a tattoo of the patron saint Santa Muerte, which through my training and experience was the patron saint of illegal smuggling. I noticed that [REDACTED] had a tattoo of Santa Muerte and [REDACTED] also had a necklace around her neck of Santa Muerte as well. Also in the vehicle there was an approximately one foot tall statue of Santa Muerte in the front passenger seat. No contraband was located inside the vehicle.

I then returned to speak to [REDACTED] and asked her why she decided to pick these people up. She stated she knew she should not have picked them up due to them possibly being illegal immigrants, but she was willing to go to jail for the safety of these people trying to look for a better life.

At that time, I spoke to one of the male subjects who was dressed in all camouflage. He advised that the cartels in Mexico told the group that they were supposed to meet at a certain location on the side of Arizona State Highway #85 and a white Toyota was supposed to come and pick them up. The vehicle that was currently on the traffic stop was a white Toyota van. He advised that the cartel had also explained that this vehicle would be a van and would be white in color. He advised the vehicle had pulled in to the pickup location and that was when [REDACTED] had yelled at them to get in and to duck under the seats. At that time, the vehicle had taken off northbound on State Highway #85. The male subject I was speaking to said it happened very quickly and [REDACTED] did not tell them anything else. All she had told them was to get in and to duck under the seats.

At that time, I then went back to speak to [REDACTED] about the inconsistencies about her story. I advised her that she would need to tell me the truth about who had hired her to come and pick up these people and how much they were supposed to pay her. She then stated "what the fuck" and began to cry and shout at me that she had only felt bad for these people. I advised her of the inconsistency in her story and what the other subjects were telling me. At that time she refused to speak to me.

At that time, I stood by as scene security and waited for Border Patrol to arrive on scene. Once Border Patrol had arrived on scene, I stood by as scene security and once scene security was no longer needed by me, I cleared the scene. Please see Deputy Sheirer's report for his side of the incident.

At this time, we did not locate any males or females that appeared to be suspicious, nor did we have any tracks of large groups of people from footprints or anything. We canvassed the area for approximately 15 minutes. There was no contact with anybody suspicious.

I attempted to contact [REDACTED] as well as a phone call. She did not answer her phone call and did not answer her house at the trailer. While at the trailer, I observed nothing considered criminal nor suspicious and was unable to get her information. I ran her name from what I had on the Mobile Data Computer (MDC), which would return if there was a [REDACTED], but lived at a different address. At that time, I did not know who was living at the residence.

At this point, USBP stated that they were clearing as well as deputies and at that time, this concluded our involvement in this case.

As I attempted to get behind that vehicle and catchup up to it, I was driving approximately 45 miles per hour based on my patrol car speedometer, however, it was observed that the vehicle was pulling away from me. I estimated that vehicle drove more that 45 miles per hour in an area where the speed limit was 25 miles per hour. I was eventually able to catchup to that vehicle and conducted a traffic stop at Solana Avenue and Malacates. It was at that point where I activated my patrol vehicle's red and blue lights, however, it was observed that vehicle failed to pull over right away nor did the driver stop in the areas they had an opportunity to pull over.

I requested a backup unit and advised Communications that vehicle was still rolling westbound on Solana Avenue. The vehicle eventually stopped at Solana Avenue and Montecito Street after I activated my patrol vehicle siren. I stood by my patrol vehicle and I shouted loudly and directed the driver to roll the window down and keep his hands out the window considering I did not know that the intention of the driver was since they did not pull over right away. Adding to that, while that vehicle was continuing to drive westbound before it came to a complete stop, I observed there were people in the backseat and also in the front seat moving back and forth.

As I approached the vehicle, I observed the occupants in the backseat and also the male individual who was sitting in the front seat had camouflage clothing, as well as wearing carpet shoes. That was a common trait for the undocumented alien who was walking on foot in the area of Ajo District as this area was known as a corridor for drugs and also human smuggling.

I directed the driver to step out of the vehicle. I asked the individual who indicated somebody gave him the car to go pick them up in the desert. I determined not to proceed to ask him any additional questions as it was very obvious that the individual was involved in human smuggling and that was not my job to conduct an immigration inspection or find out the circumstances of this

activity.

I asked the driver for his license plate, registration and proof of insurance. The driver did not have a registration or proof of insurance, however, he gave me an Arizona identification and he indicated he did not have a valid driver's license. Also, at that moment, I advised Border Patrol to respond to our location by the Ajo Communications and also Ajo Communications was advised we had only limited time to hold that individual on a traffic stop and we could not hold him beyond our traffic stop timeframe.

After running the driver who was later identified as [REDACTED]  
( DOB \*\*\*\*\*

I verified that he did not have a valid driver's license and the only document that was issued by the Motor Vehicle Division (MVD) to him was the identification card. Understanding with no driver's license fell under mandatory immobilization, I determined to tow the vehicle. I also cited [REDACTED] for one count of a civil violation of driving with no driver's license.

NOTE: Based on my training and experience as a deputy in the Ajo District, it was common that those that are involved in human smuggling also occasionally bring in smuggled narcotics in their vehicle. As a result, I determined to utilize my canine partner, Katja, for narcotic detection on the vehicle.

I ran Katja on the exterior portion of the vehicle. When I started my first pass on the rear side of the vehicle, Katja stopped for a moment and she had a sharp turn and she started on her own to detail the rear portion of the vehicle. It was very obvious that Katja was on an odor response as her mouth was closed and her breathing began to change. I gave Katja a few seconds to determine if she could detect a source of the odor, however, she could not detect the source. As a result, I did not want to over detail the trunk of the vehicle so I moved on with my search pass.

As I worked on my back pattern, I observed that Katja started getting frustrated as it was very obvious that she was on odor response on the vehicle's trunk. Katja started moving back and forth and she continuously used her nose to smell the vehicle trunk. However, Katja did not present her final alert by sitting down, but due to her body posture being changed and her breathing was also changing, I determined that the Katja was on obvious odor response and I called that as an alert. Although the canine alert gave me probable cause to search the vehicle, the vehicle was going to get inventoried regardless due to getting immobilized.

Inside the vehicle, deputies began the inventory, however, deputies could not

locate any contraband nor any illegal items in the vehicle as there were no miscellaneous items in the car. Soon after the vehicle was towed away from the scene by the tow truck company and Border Patrol also responded and took over the investigation. Border Patrol determined, after they conducted an immigration inspection, that with the exception of the driver, all other individuals were in fact undocumented aliens and they transported them away from the scene.

NOTE: The driver was also taken away by Border Patrol.

This concludes my involvement.

**SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:**

Initial Case Narrative by S. Khamseh #8061 on 12/03/21 at 1948 hrs.

Total Dictation Time = 3:53 mins.

At approximately 1700 hours on 12/03/21, I responded to the area of North Ajo Well Road and West Mead Road, in reference to a report of a suspicious person.

The reporting party was an anonymous female, indicating that there were three males who were sitting on the side of the road. They had duffel bags. This reporting party did not want to provide any additional information, nor wanted to identify herself.

Upon arrival, I came across three individuals who were walking on the side of the road. These individuals were wearing camouflage pants and were carrying camouflage bags.

When I made contact with the males, they could not speak English, and the only thing they could tell me in broken English was that they were immigrants. I did not ask for their IDs, nor did I ask for their citizenship or anything. I asked if they needed a water or if they were in need of medical attention, to which they indicated no.

I asked if I could check the males' bags, as I was just wanting to see if they had any weapons or if they were smuggling any narcotics to United States soil. They granted me consent. I searched their bags, to which they did not have any illegal items in their duffel bags.

At that time, Border Patrol was advised, and Border Patrol's estimate arrival time was somewhere between 10 to 15 minutes, since they were driving from their station from Why, Arizona. At that time, I determined that I could not hold the males any longer than that, since my contact with them was solely consensual contact, and these individuals did not commit any state-level or local criminal or civil violations.

At that time, I made a ready transmission and advised Ajo Communication of the location of these individuals. I also advised that all of the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) patrol units would return to service.

NOTE: The duration of time that my backup units and I made contact with these individuals was somewhere around three minutes.

The PCSD units cleared the scene and we all returned to service.
