On 02/03/22, at approximately 2300 hours, I was on-duty at the Force Commander for the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD). At this time, I was at a vehicle collision with serious injury at the intersection of Valencia and Camino Verde.

While we were out there, a Hispanic female came walking up the intersection, in which I thought she wanted to cross. When I began trying to speak with her, she was only speaking in Spanish and stated something about Mexico.

I brought over two deputies who spoke Spanish and began talking to the female. They informed me that she stated that she was from Mexico, not here legally, wanted to go home, and was requesting Border Patrol. I could see while the female was talking, she was beginning to tear up and cry. At this time, it was cold outside, possibly in the 40 degree range.

At this time, I then requested Communications to start a Border Patrol Unit to our location. You could tell that the female was cold and at this time, she was placed in the back of a Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteer's (SAV) vehicle who was assisting at the traffic collision. She was placed in there to warm up and was provided with water and snacks while we waited for Border Patrol to arrive. She sat in the back of the vehicle at her own freewill to warm up.

At approximately 2330 hours, Border Patrol Agent B. Leigh #T380 out of Tucson arrived on scene. He spoke with the female, who only identified herself verbally as [REDACTED]. She stated her birthday was (DOB *****

but she was very reluctant to give us that information and she could not be positively identified.

After speaking with Ms. [REDACTED], Border Patrol Agent Leigh informed me that she stated she was in the United States illegally and he was able to establish alienage at 2330 hours.

At this point, Border Patrol took custody of Ms. [REDACTED] and her backpack that she had with her, but we did not go through it. Border Patrol took custody of that backpack as well. Shortly after, they cleared the location. I cleared the location as well, concluding my involvement in the incident.

On 09/01/22, at approximately 1808 hours, while patrolling as a training unit with Deputy J. M. Settlemeyer #8360 in the Tucson Mountain District, I responded to a report in reference to a found child. The call text advised that the complainant is out dove hunting associated with vehicle white GMC pickup and came across a Hispanic female, approximately 10 to 11 years of age, last seen wearing light colored shirt possibly tan or dark green, black water jug, and a backpack. The child is in the desert area by herself and was waving at the reportee. She is approximately 75 yards away from the reportee right now. The reportee stated that he has not approached her. No one else or vehicles are around her. Reportee stated the child was walking toward him. He was advised that law enforcement had been advised. The reportee called back and advised that the girl did approach him and looked to be approximately 17 to 20 years of age; is possibly a migrant; female is now walking away from the reportee southeast into the desert area. Border Patrol called back advising that they had units en route.

Upon arrival on scene, I observed the female subject in the back of a patrol unit not in handcuffs. I was advised she only spoke Spanish. I made contact with the female subject who advised me her name was [REDACTED]. I asked her how she was. Being very limited to speaking Spanish, I was unable to get her age. I asked her if she was hungry or thirsty, in which she nodded her head yes. She was then provided water and food. I asked if she wanted to go to Border Patrol multiple times. Each time she stated yes. I advised deputies of [REDACTED] response.

On 09/06/22 at approximately 2140 hours, while on duty in Ajo, I overheard on the radio that Deputy J. Alvarez #8718 requested a backup unit to the shell station located at

It was unknown to me what the nature of this matter was.

While en route, I monitored radio traffic in attempt to learn more about the nature of the matter. However, I did not hear anything.

Upon arrival, I observed Deputy Alvarez and Deputy P. P. Guerin #9006, as well as Arizona Department of Public Safety (DPS) Trooper, all parked at the Shell gas station in a manner that indicated that they were conducting a felony stop on the vehicle. I did not observe any Deputy or potential suspect. I approached the traffic stop location from the westbound direction. The traffic stop was inside of the Shell Station. All of the patrol vehicles, as well as the violator vehicle were all facing north.

At that point, I attempted to go around Deputy Alvarez's patrol vehicle, in attempt to have a better observation of the vehicle. At this point, I made a right turn to park parallel to next to Deputy Alvarez's patrol vehicle, facing north. As soon as I got out of the vehicle, I realized that an individual was sitting on the ground, just west Deputy Alvarez's vehicle. I approached the individual. I did not observe any lacerations, not any bleeding. This individual was able to talk, was alert, and conscious. I had the individual lay down on the ground to avoid any further injury until paramedics respond.

At no time during the time that I parked my vehicle did I observe this individual sitting on the ground. Later on, I realized that deputies instructed this individual to sit on the ground while they were searching the vehicle. The parking lot was fairly dark and the individual was wearing black clothing. I did not see this individual until I stepped out of my patrol vehicle.

Later, when I talked to other deputies, I was informed that my front passenger's side tire made impact with the individual. It appeared that the individual was dragged on the ground for a few feet. The exact distance is unknown to me. Due to the nature of the incident, I immediately requested a supervisor to respond to the location. We stood by until the Traffic Unit responded to out location to conduct a follow up investigation.

I stood by as scene security. Paramedics responded and transported the individual to the hospital with non life threatening injury. Once the Traffic unit completed their investigation, I cleared the scene and returned to service.

This concludes my involvement.

NARRATIVE:

On 09/06/22 at 2142 hours, while on patrol, I was traveling northbound on Arizona State Highway #85 and had noticed a vehicle that was going southbound. I had noticed the vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed.

I had gotten a visual estimate of the vehicle going approximately 50 miles per hour (MPH) in a posted 25 MPH zone. I did have my radar on hand and had gotten a verbal strong steady tone from my radar and a display of the vehicle traveling at approximately 47 MPH in a posted 25 MPH zone.

At that time, I did a U-turn to be able to catch up to the vehicle and the vehicle pulled into

I had noticed the vehicle was bearing license plate [REDACTED] out of California. At that time, I turned on my red and blue overhead lights in my fully marked patrol vehicle. The vehicle came to a complete stop. As soon as I put my vehicle in park, I noticed the driver's side door had opened and the female driver started to approach my patrol vehicle. I then shouted at her to get back into the vehicle, which she did.

I approached the driver's side of the vehicle. I did notice that the vehicle had three rows, the driver's seat row, the second row was passenger's seats, and the third row was also passenger's seats.

I had noticed there was one male in the third row passenger's seat who was lying on his side and appeared to be trying to conceal himself in between the second row and the third row. I noticed one single male in the second row back seat who, upon initial contact, I was unable to see his right hand. I told him to place his hands on the seat in front of him.

I told the driver, later identified as [REDACTED] via her California identification (ID) card, what she was being pulled over for, and that was because of her speed.

I had asked for a backup unit and the first deputy on scene was Deputy P. P. Guerin #9006.

I asked [REDACTED] to step out of the vehicle and go stand with Deputy Guerin while I focused on the male that was in the second row of the vehicle.

I had that male step out of the vehicle, which he gave me consent to search his person and advised that he did not have any weapons on him. No weapons were located on his person.

Deputy Guerin and I advised him to have a seat by the driver's side of my vehicle. Deputy Guerin had assisted me in getting the third person out of the vehicle while Arizona Department of Public Safety (DPS) Trooper Enriquez had arrived on scene and stood by with [REDACTED]. The third subject, I advised him to keep his hands where I was able to see them and to go ahead and come out of the vehicle. I had also noted there were camouflage backpacks in the back seat, which through my training and experience, I was able to identify that this vehicle was possibly involved with human smuggling.

At that time, the subject in the third passenger row had climbed over the second row. That male was later identified as [REDACTED] via a Mexico voter's card. He had given me consent to search his person as well for weapons.

No contraband was located at that time.

While I was searching him for weapons, I had heard a vehicle pull up behind me. At that time, I heard the male that was in the second row who was sitting by the driver's side of my patrol vehicle groan as if he was in pain. I turned around and the male was on his side and was groaning in pain, possibly from being hit by a patrol vehicle. At that time, other deputies had assisted that male and I kept focus on [REDACTED] to make sure that he did not have any weapons on him. At that time, Border Patrol Agents were requested. I had [REDACTED] sit on the passenger's side of my vehicle so that he was out of the way.

I then had spoken to [REDACTED] who said that she was on her way to Garden Grove, California, which I confronted about her story due to her traveling southbound towards Mexico and not towards California. She said that she was possibly lost. She had just picked up her friends, which she was unable to give me their full legal names, but was only able to give nicknames for the two males.

[REDACTED] had given me consent to search the vehicle, which she said that the vehicle belonged to her boyfriend and it was recently recovered because it was stolen.

I had searched the vehicle and located a glass pipe with burnt residue, which through my training and experience was used to smoke an illegal substance. I asked [REDACTED] about the pipe. She said that the pipe could be used to smoke methamphetamine or THC wax.

An ambulance was called for the male that was hit with a vehicle.

When [REDACTED] was asked about the glass pipe with the burnt residue, she was read her Miranda Warnings which she said she did understand. [REDACTED] said that she was able to understand English, which most of our communication was in Spanish. She said that it was okay for me to read her Miranda Warnings in English and that she did understand.

At that time, a citation was completed for Evelyn for ARS 28-701A, Speeding, and for ARS 13-3415A, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, which is a Class 1 Misdemeanor. I advised her of the citation and of the information on the citation, and that signing the ticket was not an admission of guilt, just a promise to appear in court. [REDACTED] was given a copy of the citation.

While dealing with the situation of the male getting hit by the vehicle, I advised Evelyn that the vehicle was not allowed to move due to Traffic Unit detectives coming out to the Ajo District to investigate the scene. Which she

had agreed. She advised that she wanted me to give her a call when the vehicle was ready and a deputy had given her a ride to a hotel. Later when Traffic Unit detectives had gotten on scene, [REDACTED] was attempted to be called to come to the scene, but she did not respond.

After the detectives had cleared the scene and no contact was able to be made with [REDACTED], her car was secured and her keys were placed in safekeeping at the Ajo District Office.

Photos were taken which were uploaded to evidence.com. This incident was captured on body worn camera (BWC). Please see the video for this incident in its entirety. I then cleared the scene.

That concludes my involvement.

I then retrieved the property listed as JA2 from Ajo Property and Evidence described as a quantity of 1 with a description of vehicle keys with [REDACTED] listed as the owner. I then directed Evelyn to the Interview room where her property was along with her license. [REDACTED] confirmed that was her property and signed the property and evidence sheet taking custody of the keys at 13:05hrs. After [REDACTED] took custody of her property and license, I then directed her back out to the front of the Ajo District Office where that concluded our contact.

Narrative:

On 09/06/22 at approximately 2200 hours, I responded to Deputy Alvarez's traffic stop as a backup unit, at *****

Upon arrival, I provided scene security while Deputy Alvarez completed his investigation.

During that time, I was advised that the driver of the vehicle, identified as [REDACTED], needed to be transported to the Marine Motel, located at *****

At approximately 2323 hours, I transported [REDACTED] to the Marine Motel, where she was going to stay while she waited until the investigation, which included her vehicle, was completed. At approximately 2326 hours I arrived at the Marine Motel and dropped [REDACTED] off so she could check into her room. I then returned to the original incident location.

At approximately 0111 hours, I returned to the Marine Motel to attempt to bring [REDACTED] back to the incident location to be interviewed about the incident.

I was notified by motel staff that [REDACTED] had checked in to room 103.

I went to room 103, and knocked and announced my presence several times, but with negative contact.

I then returned to the incident location, where I provided scene security until I was no longer needed on scene, and Deputy Alvarez advised me I could leave the area.

On 09/06/22, I responded to

at the Shell gas station to assist Deputy J. Alvarez #8718 in reference to a traffic stop in which he requested a backup unit.

A few moments later, I arrived on scene and positioned my patrol vehicle to the right of Deputy Alvarez in a white van. Shortly after that, an Arizona State Trooper also responded to the incident location, placing his vehicle to the right of mine. At that time, I approached the suspect vehicle which was a beige in color four door sport utility vehicle (SUV) and began to assist Deputy Alvarez with his stop.

While I was approaching, it was apparent that Deputy Alvarez had a female outside of the vehicle whom he was speaking to on the driver's side of the vehicle. At that time, he was instructing her to come back toward me. I instructed her to stay in front of Deputy Alvarez's vehicle near the push bumpers and I instructed the Arizona State Trooper to keep eyes on her.

At that point, I made my way to Deputy Alvarez who was on the driver's side of the suspect vehicle in between the driver door and the back passenger door. At that time, the back passenger door was open and Deputy Alvarez was giving commands to a second individual to exit the vehicle. Refer to his report for his involvement in this incident and the specifics of what he was telling the individuals to do. At that point, the individual was told to step out of the vehicle and to sit down toward the back of his vehicle which would have been to the left of Deputy Alvarez's. At that point, the subject complied and walked back toward Deputy Alvarez's vehicle on his driver's side and to the left by about three feet. I looked back toward the subject and noted he was on the ground, kneeling. To ensure officer safety, I instructed him to sit down on his bottom in which he complied.

At that point, I moved over toward Deputy Alvarez to assist with a third passenger who was in the vehicle. That passenger appeared to be in the far back of the vehicle and was stumbling around while getting outside of the vehicle due to clutter in the backseat. Eventually, the third passenger made his way out of the vehicle.

While that passenger was doing so, I looked back as an additional deputy was arriving on scene. That was when I noted the deputy who had just arrived on scene to position his vehicle to the left of Deputy Alvarez had struck the individual which I told to sit down. According to what I had seen, it appeared the front passenger wheel of Deputy S. Khamseh's #8061 vehicle had brushed up against the back of the individual who was sitting down. At that point, once the individual was contacted by the back wheel, scooted forward slightly to avoid being completely run over. Once scooted over and was out of the way of the vehicle, the patrol vehicle came to a stop and Deputy Khamseh exited. At that point, I recognized the individual had been struck and appeared to be in some sort of distress as he was groaning and grabbing toward his back. At that point, I made the decision to go toward the individual who was struck by the vehicle and to leave Deputy Alvarez with the third passenger. Again, refer to his report for his involvement in this incident.

I stood by with the individual who had been hit who was currently now lying down and grabbing toward his lower back. Due to a language barrier, I was not able to communicate with the individual; however, it was apparent that he was in pain. At that point, I requested that Ajo Ambulance respond to the location and assess the individual for his injuries. Sergeant K. N. Gabriel #7323 was also advised of the incident and requested to respond to the incident location. Again, during this incident, I maintained my focus on the individual who had been struck as the rest of the individuals were cooperative and did not need my focus.

Eventually, Ajo Ambulance arrived on scene and began medical care of the individual but prior to that, I requested Border Patrol respond to the scene as it was apparent the individuals who were in the vehicle were possibly undocumented aliens given their seating position in the vehicle. Eventually, they responded to the scene as well. While waiting for Border Patrol to respond to the location, I maintained scene security as well as took photographs of the scene and the individual who was struck by a vehicle. On the individual's upper back, I noted a red mark which may have been consistent with being struck by a vehicle; however, I was unsure if it was new or not.

Ajo Ambulance elected to transport the individual to a Phoenix area hospital. Once that was completed, it was determined that the three patrol vehicles that were apart of the traffic stop would stay in place until the Traffic Unit could respond to investigate the collision between the patrol vehicle and the individual who was sitting down. At no point did I move the vehicle; however, numerous times, I entered my vehicle as well as walked around the scene. The photographs I took of the individual and the scene were eventually uploaded to Evidence.com under this case number as well as Case #220906297.

Once that was completed and my photographs were submitted into evidence, I stood by on scene until the Traffic Unit could respond and conduct their own investigation. At that point, I completed an interview with the Traffic Unit and was eventually advised by them that the scene was clear and we could exit the location.

This concludes my involvement in this incident.

On 12/03/22 at 0610 hours, I just got off duty, but I was still in my patrol vehicle heading home on Wilmot Road and Andrada Road, at which point I heard my radio of Deputy J. M. Creel #8117 conducting a traffic stop on McGee Ranch Road and Garrison Hills Drive.

A short time later, Deputy Creel got on the radio and stated there was a bailout from this traffic stop and there were nine individuals that bailed out of the vehicle. At this point, I did not observe any other units assisting. I radioed Deputy Creel if he needed assistance which he stated he did.

Due to the distance where Deputy Creel was at and with nine individuals bailed out in the vicinity, I initiated my emergency lights and proceeded to assist him. I arrived on scene at approximately 10 to 15 minutes later. I was the second deputy to arrive as a backup unit. I observed a black sedan off the side of the road, on the east side hitting a guard fence.

The driver's side door was open. I assisted Deputy Creel in clearing the vehicle. I had my weapon drawn at which time there were no persons inside the vehicle. I placed my weapon back in my holster and stayed on scene security for about 10 minutes. Border Patrol was en route due to the possibility of the bailout being undocumented aliens. With Deputy Creel safe, the scene secured, and other deputies arriving on scene, I then cleared with no further follow-up.

While on patrol in the Green Valley District on 12/03/22 at approximately 0610 hours, I responded to a call in reference to what started as a traffic stop by Deputy J. M. Creel #8117 who advised he was out with a vehicle that was not stopping at that time and appeared to be coming to a slow stop. Upon doing so, he advised via radio communication that multiple occupants in the vehicle who appeared to be undocumented aliens rushed out of the vehicle and left the vehicle which rolled into a barbed wire fence area. Upon hearing this information, I continued to show myself en route to the area of West Magee Ranch Road and Garrison Hills Drive in Green Valley, Arizona and advised Communications that I would be en route being that I was one of the closer units at this time. Given this information provided and the exigent nature of the incident, I activated my emergency equipment and continued with exigency to the location of incident.

Once again, I continued to note that the information provided by Deputy Creel was that the vehicle was on the side of the road now and was not blocking but all the occupants appeared to have left the vehicle. He had not yet cleared the vehicle due to the fact that he was by himself and was awaiting an additional unit. At that point, I shortly after made contact with Deputy Creel and was able to assist in assuring there were no other individuals in the vehicle and the vehicle was unoccupied. During this time, I also noted that this vehicle veered off to the side of the road into a barb wire fence area. The vehicle was still in park and still on as well as playing the radio during this time.

At this point, I noted the vehicle appeared to be a black 2012 Dodge Journey and due to the fact that it had been abandoned, it was a mandatory immobilization as well as I noted the fact that the vehicle's license plate was considered to be [REDACTED]. Once again, due to the fact of it being under Border Patrol's jurisdiction, the vehicle would be immobilized and taken for storage. At that point, I noted Deputy Creel advised for a tow truck to be en route and once again continued to stand by as scene security as it was unknown where these individuals ran off into into the desert area and safety measures were to be taken at this point due to the fact that we were unaware if these individuals would come back or continue into the desert area and once again stood by and provided scene security until I released Deputy Creel. We cleared the area and I waited for the tow truck to arrive. Prior to the tow truck arriving, I was able to take photos of the vehicle as well as the license plate of the vehicle as well as the interior of the vehicle, noting the fact that the vehicle was still

left in drive and where the vehicle landed upon it being left to slowly roll into the desert area.

Once again, I continued to stand by as the tow truck driver attached the vehicle to the back of his tow truck and shortly after cleared the area with the vehicle and noted that during this time also, Deputy P. J. Rodriguez #8586 was on scene, I continued to fill out a tow sheet for the vehicle. After noting that the United States Border Patrol would be en route, an unknown time of arrival, I noted my assistance was no longer needed and Deputy Rodriguez would be standing by. I was able to clear the area and returned back to patrol.

On 12/03/22 at approximately 0605 hours, as I was westbound on West McGee Ranch Road from South Garrison Hills Drive, I observed a black colored sport utility vehicle (SUV) driving eastbound at what appeared to be a very low rate of speed. It appeared as I came around a curve in the roadway that the vehicle was moving from the westbound lanes heading eastbound. I observed a small cloud of dust indicating that the vehicle could have possibly left the roadway on that side of the roadway. As I observed this, I made a U-turn in the roadway now heading eastbound after the dark colored SUV.

After making the U-turn, I observed the vehicle to accelerate. As I continued to catch up to the vehicle, I activated my overhead emergency equipment. The vehicle continued to drive at which time I activated my sirens as well. The vehicle slowed further, continuing to roll down the roadway at a slow speed. It was at this point that it switched over to the south frequency and advised Communications of the traffic stop. As I did so, the back passenger's side door opened and then closed and then opened once more slightly. The vehicle once again slowed. As it did, I observed approximately seven to nine persons exit from the vehicle on both sides. The vehicle continued to roll at a slow speed as all occupants exited from the vehicle, to include the driver. I believe that all the persons in the vehicle were most likely undocumented given the area and the fact that the vehicle was registered to an address in Phoenix.

I continued to follow behind the vehicle as the vehicle left the roadway and slowly stopped. I stood by with the vehicle with my overhead emergency equipment activated as I waited for backup units to arrive. As Deputy M. J. Aragon #6701 and Deputy J. A. Flores-Rodriguez #8870 arrived on scene, I approached the vehicle and ensured there were no occupants inside.

I contacted Communications and requested that a tow truck start in order to mandatory immobilize the vehicle due to the fact that the vehicle was involved in human smuggling. I remained on scene until being relieved by Deputy P. J. Rodriguez #8586. At that point I departed from the area, therefore, concluding my involvement in this incident.
