SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:

Initial Case Narrative by M. D. Salmon #6302 on 01/13/23 at 0309 hrs.

On 01/12/23, at approximately 2326 hours, I was working as a member of the Canine Unit. I was in the Foothills patrol district, and I was exiting Interstate 10 westbound on Orange Grove Road. As I was getting off of the off ramp to turn onto eastbound Orange Grove Road, I noticed there was a pickup truck in front of me bearing Arizona license plate # [REDACTED]. The exit ramp had a drive through lane to continue onto Orange Grove Road. There was no traffic control device to stop as it merged off of the freeway into its own lane on Orange Grove Road.

The vehicle in front of me caught my attention because it pulled up awkwardly at that intersection and came to a stop in the roadway, impeding traffic. I noted the turn signal for the truck was on; however, the truck had gone over the white line to the left and appeared it was going to strike the curb before it stopped. The vehicle waited for several moments as I parked behind it, and a vehicle behind me honked. The truck moved, eventually correcting itself and pulling out onto Orange Grove Road. The vehicle continued at a very slow rate of speed up towards Thornydale Road. Based on the driving behavior of impeding traffic, I believed the vehicle was possibly showing signs and symptoms of impairment.

Therefore, I conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The vehicle slowed and came to a stop just before the AMPM on Orange Grove Road and Thornydale Road. The vehicle came to a stop. I called out the traffic stop on the north one radio frequency. I began my approach to the vehicle on the driver's side. I immediately noted in the bed of the pickup truck there were two individuals laying down. They were wrapped up tightly in a blanket. I could see there were four feet sticking out from the blanket. They did not move, or appear to make any contact with me. I then moved up to the rear passenger compartment of the truck. I noted the back seats were filled up and there were three individuals curled up together, laying down. They were not in seats, they were not restrained, and they pretended to be asleep. They made no acknowledgement of me as I shined my flashlight through the window onto the three individuals. I then noted the driver and front seat passenger were both younger Hispanic males.

I began speaking with them, and they both informed me they did not speak and English. At this point in time, based on my training and experience, I determined this was a vehicle involved with human smuggling. I requested backup units respond to assist. I then spoke with the driver. In Spanish, he informed me he was 15 years old and did not have a driver's license, and provided me the key for the truck upon my request. He handed me a single ignition key that had a

key tag on it from an auto body or mechanic shop in Mexico. There were no other keys on the key ring which also confirmed my suspicion of human smuggling. They had no paperwork for the vehicle.

I then stood by until other deputies arrived on scene. Deputy S. C. Stoermer #7131 arrived on scene first. I explained to him the situation and how I wanted to start securing and detaining the individuals. A Marana Police Department (MPD) sergeant then also stopped out to assist. We were able to detain the driver and passenger first, then the three females from the back of the truck, and then two males from the bed of the truck. None of the individuals spoke English, and Border Patrol was requested. All of the individuals appeared to be in good physical condition. I noted there was some food and drink trash in the truck.

I then stood by with the individuals. The driver was handcuffed and detained separately in Deputy Stoermer's vehicle. The front seat passenger was also detained. The three females were handcuffed together, and the other two male subjects were handcuffed. They were all sat down on the curb and awaited Border Patrol. At approximately 0047 hours, Border Patrol Agent MacLellan #T236 arrived on scene. He conducted an immigration inspection and informed me he would be taking custody of the five Mexican citizens. The driver and front seat passenger claimed they were United States citizens, and he was not going to be taking custody of them, or the pickup truck. I then confirmed he was not going to investigate any the smuggling, and he stated he was not, he was just going to take the Mexican citizens, as they did not have any documentation to be in the United States legally. The driver had a Utah birth certificate photo copy in his possession, and the front seat passenger had a tattered and worn Arizona birth certificate.

The Border Patrol agent then left the scene. Deputy Stoermer took custody of the two juvenile males. It was determined the driver was actually 14 years of age, and the front seat passenger was 16 years of age.

I contacted Mobile Maintenance and Towing (MM&T) to respond to take custody of the pickup truck for mandatory immobilization due the fact the 14 year old driver did not have any driver's license, or record of ever having a driver's license. I conducted an inventory search of the vehicle. I noted there were several Red Bull cans and phone chargers in the truck. There was also a jack and lug wrench. There was not anything else of value in the truck.

I researched the registered owner of the truck and found a FORCE record of him with a general delivery address in Douglas, Arizona. The phone number in FORCE was called; however, the phone was not in service. At approximately 0145 hours,

MM&T arrived and took custody of the truck. I called Terminal Operations and received Verification #108 from Badge #8241.

I then responded with Deputy Stoermer to the Foothills District Office while he was conducting administrative follow up to the Department of Child Safety (DCS) in order to make arrangements for someone to take custody of the juveniles. I learned that the juveniles had involvements with DCS prior for smuggling, as well. Deputy Stoermer handled that. I cleared with no further involvement.

This concludes my involvement in this case.

Both juveniles stated they were from Sonora, Mexico. Both of which had no physical photo identification, just the provided paperwork.

EVIDENCE:

Arizona Department of Child Safety (DCS) notice of removal for both juveniles reference Assessment #00863072, and Assessment #00863073.

NARRATIVE:

On 01/12/23, at approximately 2328 hours, while on patrol and assigned to the Foothills District midnight section, while monitoring radio traffic, I heard Canine Handler Deputy M. D. Salmon #6302 request for additional cover deputies to his location. He conducted a traffic stop on West Orange Grove Road just West of North Thornydale Road. I responded from another unrelated call in the immediate area. I arrived shortly thereafter.

Deputy Salmon's patrol vehicle was facing eastbound on the shoulder of the roadway with a full sized extended cab Dodge pickup truck. As I walked by, I noticed there were individuals in the back seat of the vehicle. I was also advised by Deputy Salmon of the situation where the driver was 14 years of age, the passenger was 16. They had some form of identification and there were three

individuals in the rear portion of the extended cab, and two individuals in the bed of the truck. We waited for other units to arrive before having any of the individuals get out to detain them.

I tried speaking with the passenger who was wearing a red hoodie and jeans. He said he had a birth certificate. He tried providing it to me, but at that time, I told him to hold on to it, but he did not speak any English.

Once other units arrived, Deputy Salmon and I assisted in taking the driver out first. Once he was placed in handcuffs, double-locked for safety and security, and patted down. I escorted him back to my patrol vehicle, placed him in the back seat as to isolate him from the others detained. Shortly thereafter, we had all of the individuals out, detained, and in handcuffs. There were approximately six, the passenger plus five others.

I stood by with the driver in my vehicle until United States Border Patrol (USBP) arrived on scene and interviewed the driver, passenger, and other occupants. I was advised shortly thereafter that the driver and passenger, given that they had some form of identification; although, it was not a picture, USBP could have no involvement with them, and took custody of the other five individuals who apparently were undocumented.

At that point, while on scene, I contacted DCS at their hotline. I spoke with Hotline Specialist Dorinda #4229. Shortly thereafter, I was turned over to a supervisor and advised they were at the Phoenix region office, and given the situation that I had two minors with no physical identification and a language barrier and stating they were from Mexico, a call for service of our local Tucson DCS branch was placed. While waiting for confirmation, I then transported both the driver and passenger juveniles to the Foothills District Office, as one of them stated they needed to use the restroom.

After Deputy Salmon completed towing the vehicle, Deputy Salmon then proceeded to the Foothills District Office, where both juveniles were taken out of handcuffs and provided a bottle of water, some snacks, and allowed to use the facilities until we could determine where they were going. I was provided a name of who was possibly an immediate family member for one of the individuals, which turned out to be one of the probation officers (PO) out of the Phoenix region. By this time, I was directly in touch with the Tucson district supervisor.

After I was unable to contact any immediate relatives, I once again contacted the DCS supervisor of the Tucson chapter. A plan was formulated where the Tucson chapter would petition for a Notice of Removal to take custody of both juveniles, and requested I proceed to their office locally at

I arrived at the facility, with the assistance of intake staff, while waiting for the aforementioned Notice of Removal forms to be completed by a judge, the staff on hand spoke fluent Spanish and were asking the juveniles questions.

NOTE: At this time, both juveniles were not in handcuffs, they were just waiting for the intake process to be taken into custody.

I did have a staff member ask both of the juveniles whose vehicle they were utilizing at the time of this incident. The passenger, [REDACTED], who was wearing a red hoodie, stated to the worker that it was the people who they worked for. I then in turn asked who those people were, or where they were coming from. [REDACTED] stated he did not know who the people were, they were just given directions on social media on where to find the vehicle in Douglas, Arizona, and proceed to an undisclosed location in Phoenix, Arizona, with the other five occupants who were also detained and USBP took into custody. I then asked both juvenile once again, with the assistance of the staff translating, if this was their first time smuggling, or transporting individuals, and if so, why did they stop on Orange Grove Road in Pima County? [REDACTED] indicated by putting up two fingers and said it was his second time. The driver, [REDACTED], put up one finger that it was his first time driving.

As for pulling off the freeway where the traffic stop took place, they stated they needed to refuel their vehicle, they needed to get gas. Just out of curiosity, I asked if they were paid for this event. They said they had not yet been, but had they completed their destination and took the five individuals, they would be paid approximately \$2,000 for their trip from Douglas to Phoenix, to be split between the two juveniles.

Once again, I asked where exactly they lived. They stated they lived in Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico. But they did not disclose the actual physical address, nor did they have any phone numbers, but they did have cellular phones on their persons at the time.

At that time, I was escorted to another office where I was provided the Arizona DCS Notice of Removal for both juveniles. Again, Assessment #00863072, for [REDACTED], the driver, and Assessment #00863073, for [REDACTED]. Neither juvenile had any further information to provide, nor did they have any questions. Their personal effects were provided to the intake staff. There was no further criminal or suspicious activity noted. The on shift supervisor, Sergeant B. P. Kunze #1115 was advised of the actions taken. For further details

regarding Deputy Salmon's actions, observations, and initial cause for the traffic stop, please defer to his initial case report.

This concludes my involvement.

On 03/15/23, I responded to

at the Catepillar, Inc. in reference to a trespass call. While en route to the call, Communications advised that five males on foot were on the property where they were not supposed to be.

Upon arriving on scene, I made contact with site security, [REDACTED]

(DOB *****

[REDACTED] advised they found the five individuals walking on the property around 1300 hours when they made contact with them. They did not cause any issue and sat down. [REDACTED] then contacted the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) for us to come out. They also contacted the United States Border Patrol (USBP) who advised they were going to have an extended response upward of an hour and a half to two hours.

Upon arrival, the men were sitting on the ground. They stated they were in the United States for work. They did not have any identification on them. They all had backpacks with some extra clothing and water. When asked if they had any weapons or drugs, they all responded no.

We had Communications contact the USBP to receive an updated response time, to which they stated it would be extended upward of an hour and a half. We asked the men if they wanted a ride into town. They stated yes. We checked them for weapons and placed them into the back of our patrol vehicles. We then drove from

to the Taco Bell at

80 Duval Mine Road

in Green Valley.

While en route, Deputy J. R. Mesa #1378 received a call from USBP who advised that an agent would be meeting us at the Taco Bell to take the men into custody.

Upon arrival at the Taco Bell, the men were handed off to Border Patrol Agent J. Diaz #T578 at 1408 hours.

On May 10, 2023, at approximately 2341 hours while working as a two-man training unit I responded to the area of W Ajo Hwy and W Old Ajo referencing a traffic stop. The Deputy at the traffic stop had requested a backup unit and for Border Patrol to be advised.

Upon arriving I observed Deputies on scene, who had the male driver secured in handcuffs by a patrol vehicle. In the vehicle from the traffic stop there was a female and male passenger dressed fully in camouflage clothing. I was then advised that the passengers only spoke Spanish. Deputies on scene had also observed the male passenger reach with his hands towards a bag that was around the front of his body.

I assisted with removing the passengers from the vehicle speaking to them in Spanish. Once the male was out of the vehicle, I secured him in handcuffs, double locking them and checking them for tightness. The male was then secured in the back of a patrol vehicle.

I then asked the female passenger to step out of the vehicle. I secured the female in handcuffs, double locking them and checking them for tightness.

I stood by with the passengers while Border Patrol arrived. Once Border Patrol arrived on scene they took custody of the passengers.

This concludes my involvement in this incident.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:

Initial Case Narrative by D. A. Metz #8594 on 05/11/23 at 0207 hrs.

Total Dictation Time = 6:53 mins.

On 05/10/23 at approximately 2331 hours, while assigned to the San Xavier District and patrolling the area of Ajo and Old Ajo, I observed a vehicle driving eastbound to which I observed a vehicle bearing the license plate of # [REDACTED] continuing eastbound as well. I ran a registration check to which I observed the temporary tag that they displayed was expired. I initiated a traffic stop.

As I made contact with the driver, [REDACTED], identified through his Arizona identification card, I observed he was extremely nervous. I asked him where he was coming from. He stated he was coming from the Sierrita Mountain area and he was heading back to his house. I noted the backseat of his car to which I proceeded to ask him whose car it was. He stated it was his friend, [REDACTED], car and he lent it to him.

I proceeded to look through the back window with my flashlight to which I observed a face covered in camouflage. As he rolled down the window, I noted there were two subjects which through my training and experience I was able to identify as possible undocumented aliens in the backseat of his car, lying down. I noted the male subject got up real quick and began to reach in his pockets. I attempted to advise him to let me see his hands. I had [REDACTED] get out of the vehicle where I placed him in handcuffs. I asked him if he had any weapons on him to which he stated he did not. I checked for weapons and placed him on the push bumper of my car. I asked him if there were any more people in the trunk to which he stated there were not.

When other deputies arrived, we were able to detain the two undocumented aliens in the backseat. I also requested Border Patrol to respond. While waiting for them to respond, I proceeded to read [REDACTED] his Miranda Rights. He stated he understood. [REDACTED] began to tell me that his friend asked him to drive his car out to help an alleged other friend out of Sierrita Mountain because they had broken down. He stated when he got there, he observed the broken down vehicle that was camouflaged and both the two subjects were camouflaged. He stated when he pulled up, they proceeded to get in. I asked him how much he was getting for driving. He stated \$100. I asked him if it was per head to which he stated it was only \$100 and he thought he was just helping out his friend's friend.

I asked him if there were any other substances inside the car to which he stated there were not. I asked [REDACTED] if he knew they were undocumented aliens. He stated he did not know but he knew he felt like it was a fishy situation when he

had already gotten there and they were in camouflage waiting outside a car that was covered in a camouflage type pattern. He stated they just proceeded to get in his car and he drove back. I asked him where he was taking them. He initially stated he was taking them to his house and then stated that he was going to his neighbor's house in the same trailer park.

I attempted to confirm with him that he knew they were undocumented aliens, the way they were dressing, to which he stated he did not know and he had four kids and he was trying to make a little bit of extra cash. He stated he was an engineer by trade but ultimately stuck with the story that he was only getting \$100 for them.

Border Patrol arrived on scene and I advised them of my findings. They stated that ultimately, it was determined they were going to take the entire call including seizing the car. I asked [REDACTED] if I could empty out his pockets to which I proceeded to empty out on my hood. I only located some chains and some lighters as well as his hat.

Ultimately, after discussing with Border Patrol, they were going to take him as well. I spoke with [REDACTED] again to which he advised he went near the Speedway at Sierrita Mountain and stated that he went to Sierrita Mountain and Diamond Bell Ranch Road and stated that that was where the car was supposedly broken down at that the undocumented aliens were standing outside of. He also stated that by the Speedway, there were a bunch of mailboxes and that was where he was supposed to go as well. I was unable to pinpoint a location on where this supposed car was. I attempted to confirm with [REDACTED] many times that he knew they were undocumented aliens. At one point, he stated he knew they were undocumented aliens when he got there but then began to talk about how he did not know they were undocumented aliens until I pulled them over and they attempted to hide. He stated they were sitting there normally until I pulled them over. That was when they proceeded to lie down. Ultimately, Border Patrol took custody of them as well as his vehicle to which they cleared from the scene.

When they cleared from the scene and I was attempting to clear from the scene, I noted the items that were in [REDACTED] pockets were still on my hood. I attempted to call the Border Patrol Agent Mitchell #T404 who took the case. He asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] cared about any of the belongings that were left in which he stated he did not and I could throw them away. Border Patrol also provided me with their case number # [REDACTED]. Once Border Patrol cleared from the scene, I attempted to go down to where Albert said the other vehicle was waiting and ultimately, I was unable to locate it. I cleared from the scene a short time later.

On 07/17/23, at approximately 0146 hours, while on patrol in the Foothills District, I responded to

at the Northwest Hospital, Emergency Room #6, in reference to a rescue follow-up. The call text stated a female was brought into the emergency room by a passerby who found her on the side of the road. The female was unconscious, unresponsive and covered in bruises. The emergency room still was attempting to find an identification for the female.

Upon my arrival at the hospital, I entered and was escorted to Room #6. From what I could observe outside the room, there were approximately six medical staff treating the patient. I got information from a registered nurse (RN). He advised me a male with red hair brought the female into the hospital in a wheelchair and then left.

A doctor exited the room and identified herself as Dr. West with Northwest Hospital. She advised me they located Sonoran currency on her person and observed her feet to be in very bad shape and made a comment of, "The female put some miles on those feet." She advised me it was possibly heat exhaustion or dehydration.

I was able to step into the room briefly to look at the female. She had an [REDACTED] and was unresponsive, but breathing. I also observed her eyes to be wide open, but they were red, watery and bloodshot.

I exited the room due to them needing to take the patient to another operating room for a CAT scan and X-rays.

As I was standing by outside, the RN escorted me to the hospital security room where I was able to view camera footage on the male who brought her in here. Please see the Sheriff's Department evidence associated with the case number for further information. Videos and pictures were obtained of the subject driving her to the hospital and taking her inside.

From what I could observe in the camera footage, a male driving a red Ford F150 parked in the front parking lot of the hospital, walked in asking for a wheelchair. As the male made his way out to his vehicle, he put the female into

the wheelchair, wheeling her back into the hospital. As they got into the hospital, I observe the female to be "dead weight" as she was unable to move.

I contacted Sergeant R. M. Inglett #5061, the Foothills District supervisor, of my findings. I contacted Border Patrol of my findings and they advised me they would not be responding due to the female being unconscious and they would be unable to conduct an interview. I spoke with Border Patrol Agent Carter #T0333.

The female also had a note on her person stating: [REDACTED], and below it stating Husband, with phone number

*****.

I attempted making telephonic to that phone number and the phone number sent me to an automated voice messaging system. I was unable to get ahold of a person associated with that phone number. There was another phone number of

***** [REDACTED].

That phone number was not valid and I could not make telephonic contact with that number. I took deputy photos of the paper that was left behind with the female. The female did not have any sort identification on her and was not identified.

For the brief time I saw her, she appeared to be in rough shape with markings such as bruises on her person that had occurred in the past.

All photos and videos were uploaded onto the Sheriff's Department Axon.

Medical staff advised me the female would be admitted into the hospital for at least a couple of days, and will be possibly transported to another hospital.

Throughout my findings, I observed the female to be an undocumented alien.

This concludes my involvement in this case.

On 07/17/23, at approximately 1852 hours, I took a phone report of a supplement suspicious activity call at

which was the [REDACTED] Hospital. The call text stated that it was reference Case #230717011 and the reportee, who was a Registered Nurse at [REDACTED] Hospital, had additional information about family member contacts.

At that time, before making telephonic contact with the reportee, I looked at the original call text of Case #230717011. I was able to see that the incident occurred at 0146 hours on 07/17/23 and the call text was about a Registered Nurse calling from [REDACTED] Hospital in reference to a female that was brought into the emergency room by a passerby who found her on the side of the road. The female was unconscious, unresponsive and covered in bruises. The emergency room was attempting to find identification for the female.

Once I saw what the original call text was about, due to the initial case deputy's report not available yet, I then made telephonic contact with the reportee. As I made telephonic contact with the reportee, she identified herself to me verbally as [REDACTED] and stated she was the charge nurse at [REDACTED] Hospital. She advised me she wanted to provide information to law enforcement in reference to the John Doe female that they currently had.

[REDACTED] advised me that this John Doe patient came in earlier in the morning on today's date, unresponsive, and was dropped off by an unknown male and they had no information on that male. Traci then advised me that a woman had called today looking for a female by the name of [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised the woman who had called that they did not have anybody by that name.

At that point, the woman that was speaking to [REDACTED] on the phone, had advised that [REDACTED] was 23 years old and provided a description for [REDACTED] to see if [REDACTED] was currently a patient at [REDACTED] Hospital. [REDACTED] stated that she advised the woman that there was nobody by the name of [REDACTED] at the hospital, and was not allowed to say whether the description provided matched any of the patients.

[REDACTED] did advise me that the description that the woman gave to [REDACTED] for this [REDACTED] person, did in fact match the description of the John Doe patient they currently had who was brought by an unknown male earlier in the morning. Traci stated she did not let the woman know of that information.

[REDACTED] stated she attempted to get more information about the woman who had called asking for [REDACTED] and the only information the woman gave was that her name was [REDACTED]. She did not provide a phone number, address or date of birth for herself. The woman, [REDACTED] simply stated she was the patient's ([REDACTED]) sister's friend.

[REDACTED] continued to ask the woman, [REDACTED] more questions and [REDACTED] had mentioned to her that the patient's sister got a phone call from someone who was in the car last night and that person, whoever that was, told the sister that she was dead. [REDACTED] advised me that [REDACTED] had first stated that whoever was in the vehicle with the patient, [REDACTED] she had initially stated that she was dead, but then changed it and stated "might not be dead". Essentially, [REDACTED] advised me the woman, [REDACTED] was basically calling to see if the patient ([REDACTED]) was alive.

[REDACTED] asked the woman, [REDACTED], if she had the sister's information and [REDACTED] had provided the name of [REDACTED] who was the sister of the patient by the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] lives in Savannah, Georgia and was only Spanish speaking. She also had a phone number for that sister by the name of [REDACTED] of
*****.

At that time I asked Traci if she was able to get a phone number from that woman who claimed to be the patient's sister's friend. [REDACTED] advised me the call came in as a transferred call since the woman, [REDACTED], called the emergency room and the emergency room transferred the phone call over to the ICU part of the hospital so there was no phone number listed and they were not able to go back and check the history because if they did, it only came back to the emergency room phone number.

Traci advised me that while she was speaking to [REDACTED] it seemed as though [REDACTED] was not wanting to provide any information about herself and it would be possible that she had given a fake name as well since she did not want to provide a phone number or address to get in contact with her. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] was very hesitant on even providing just her name.

At that point I then asked what the condition of the John Doe patient was. [REDACTED] advised me that because she came in with trauma, she was now currently on life support as of right now. I advised [REDACTED] that I was going to make some phone calls and that I would get back to her if I needed something. She stated that was fine. I then notified Night Detective E. K. Gieron #1255 who advised me to do follow up at [REDACTED] Hospital which I did.

I went over to [REDACTED] Hospital where I spoke with the lady at the front desk of the emergency room. I asked if I could speak with [REDACTED] who was a charge nurse in ICU and the lady at the front desk advised me she was currently in ICU Room 31 which was on the second floor. Security was able to direct me to [REDACTED] which I was then able to make contact with her in person.

I then met with [REDACTED] I advised her I was there due to needing to get some further information about this John Doe female patient. I asked [REDACTED] if it was possible for me to take pictures of the John Doe patient and she stated she was going to find out for me which, later on, I was advised by [REDACTED] the admin nursing supervisor, that it was fine for me to take pictures of the female which I later did. Please reference photos taken.

At that time I started asking [REDACTED] the status of the John Doe female. [REDACTED] and another charge nurse by the name of [REDACTED] both advised me that the John Doe female was not brain dead, but that she was on life support. They continued to advise me that the John Doe female had came in unconscious and unresponsive and because of that they had to put her on [REDACTED] They stated [REDACTED] because when she arrived, she was unconscious and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] advised me that when someone is on [REDACTED], they are usually sedated to keep them from fighting it, but they advised me that the John Doe female had significantly worsened since she had been there at the hospital. [REDACTED] advised me that she did not have any broken bones, but she did have lots of bruising throughout her body and that there was no brain bleeding, but that she did have [REDACTED]. They also advised me that they noticed the John Doe female had open blisters on her feet as if she had been

walking barefoot for a long period of time. [REDACTED], the charge nurse, advised me that they are ruling her out for tuberculosis at that time and in order for me to take pictures, I would have to wear personal protective equipment.

At that time, to further document the information about the John Doe female, the nursing supervisor, [REDACTED], allowed me to take pictures of the female's body and of the bruising she had. Please refer to my photos for further information. While I was taking photos of the John Doe female's body, I noticed she had several bruising throughout her body and it appeared that she had some chaffing in the inner parts of her right thigh near her vagina. I was unable to see anything more significant on the outside of her body.

Once I finished taking pictures of the John Doe female's body, I then went over to speak with the security who was currently working. I spoke [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if he was able to provide me the original footage of the incident from earlier in the day when the female was brought in by an unknown male. [REDACTED] advised me he was not able to get the original footage because he has to go through Risk Management first in order to get it. He advised me that the director's phone number was

and that he was the security director and he goes by the name of [REDACTED]

Please note that before I had arrived there at the hospital, a couple of minutes before I arrived at the hospital today, a male had dropped off a post-it note with phone numbers on it and dropped it off anonymously for the patient by the name of Fabiola.

So at that point, I continued to speak with [REDACTED]. I asked him if he could pull up the video footage of the male leaving the post-it note at the front desk in the emergency room. [REDACTED] was able to locate the male at 1918 hours on the video footage on 07/17/23 of a male entering from the east side emergency room door and walked over to the front desk where he asked the male at the front desk for a sticky note which he started writing phone numbers on it and advised the front desk that it was for [REDACTED] but did not provide his own name when doing so. Pictures were taken of the sticky notes as well as it was taken and placed into Evidence at the Foothills Substation lockers.

[REDACTED] advised me that she was notified by the front desk that the male had come into the emergency room and handed the charge nurse in the emergency room a post-it note with phone numbers that said mom and then a phone number and then apparently a husband's name on there as well and they stated it was an anonymous person.

At that point in time, I asked [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], both charge nurses, if they had the clothes that this John Doe patient had came in. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] advised me they had cut off her clothing and threw it away because it had feces all over it and that the emergency room had cut off her clothing and so when she came into ICU, she was already in a gown so they believed that her clothing was thrown away due to it being a biohazard.

At a later time, another nurse was able to find a bag in the room that the John Doe female was in. In the bag was some clothing which the nurses all verified belonged to the John Doe female. The only missing piece of clothing was the t-shirt in which the nurses stated that the shirt was cut off of the John Doe patient and thrown away. Pictures were taken and in that bag there were a pair of wet blue jeans, as well as a pair of black tennis shoes, shoelaces, and a white phone charger cord. There was also Mexican currency in the pockets of the blue jeans; a 100 pesos paper Mexican currency, with one five pesos coin Mexican currency. All of these items were placed into Evidence at the Foothills Substation Evidence locker.

At this point in time, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were given the case number in case they received further phone calls in reference to this possible John Doe patient. Both charge nurses were also advised to call the non emergency line if the John Doe Patient gets moved to another hospital. It was stressed the importance of knowing where this John Doe patient will be going.

I then left the hospital.

I then went back to see the original report by Deputy J. T. McEuen #9340 which I noted that Deputy McEuen attempted to make telephonic contact with the phone numbers that the John Doe female had on a piece of white paper. It stated in Deputy McEuen's report that he was attempting to make telephonic contact, but I was unsure whether he had left a voicemail or not so at that time I called Deputy McEuen to verify whether he had possibly left a voicemail stating why he was calling in reference to this John Doe female. He advised me he did not leave a voicemail as he was unable to. So at no point in time was any information given out to those people that the phone numbers belonged to.

Once all information was provided to Detective E. K. Gieron #1255 and no other information was needed at this time, I then cleared the scene.

On 07/17/23, I received a call from Deputy A. G. Morales #8812 reference an advisory. This was in reference to a follow up supplement at Northwest Hospital. The information was that earlier under Case #230711017, a female was brought into Northwest Hospital unresponsive. The female was brought in according to the information by a good samaritan who found her on the side of the road. It was later determined in the investigation that the location was La Cholla Boulevard and River Road area. The information I got from patrol was that a female called claiming to be the sister; however, according to medical staff, she did not know much information and did not give a lot of information. Also, earlier in the evening around 1700 hours, someone came to the hospital possibly looking for the female. According to Patrol, the female was on life support in the ICU. After speaking to Deputy Morales, I attempted to read the report which was not transcribed yet. I contacted Transcription to have them transcribe the report as a priority. I also contacted my supervisor, Sergeant E. Cervantez #6537, and advised him of the information I got from Patrol and that I would be en route to the hospital to assist if necessary and determine what exactly the status of the female was.

During the entire investigation, I kept my supervisor informed step by step via the information that we received. I responded to [REDACTED] Hospital, walking in through the emergency room. There was a RNP where a nurse practitioner named [REDACTED] whom I had contact with in the past, advised that they had some information reference phone numbers. One phone number was out of Florida. It was a [REDACTED] number. There was another number that started [REDACTED] but had four digits and then another four digits. The [REDACTED] number was

Phone #*****.

That phone number was later discovered to be out of Florida. Prior to my arrival, I got information from Deputy Morales that she would be up in the ICU where the female subject was, getting other information reference the female subject and her status. Prior to entering [REDACTED] Hospital, I was able to read the report that was transcribed by the initial deputy. Information was the female was brought in by a male who found her on the side of the road. She was unresponsive and limp. The male subject left after bringing her in. The deputy got security video. The subject left in a red F150. For any information, please see his report. According to the information that the deputy had at the time, the female subject was unconscious and non responsive. Medical staff was tending to her. According to the doctor, she had put some miles on her feet. That was

the doctor's quote in the report that the deputy relayed and also, she was dehydrated or had some heat related issue. Border Patrol was contacted but there was no identification on the female other than Mexico currency and a note with her.

After reviewing the report and going inside, making contact with the RN, [REDACTED] and getting the information that they had, again reference the phone numbers, one phone number for the husband was left as Santiago. The other number that appeared to have too many digits just said mom. I was escorted to the service elevators for staff allowed in to go to the second floor to the ICU where the female was. When I got to the ICU, attempting to make contact with Deputy Morales, I was advised she had just left; however, I began speaking to the nurse about the female. I was advised the female was on life support due to the fact that [REDACTED]. I was also given information that there were no drugs in her system and her toxicology screen was clear. Also, the staff was concerned about bruising on the female's body and an edema to the back of the head. She had blisters on her feet and was nonresponsive at the time. Her prognosis for recovery appeared to be in their eyes, questionable. They still had not identified her. She had not responded. She had been unconscious and intubated since. Also, at the time I made contact, they had her isolated in Room #20. They had her on [REDACTED] but they were taking precautions.

I explained to the hospital staff concerning the fact that we would be investigating and depending on the investigation, other units may respond at other times. Hospital staff gave us the note that was found on her with the same numbers that were given to me by [REDACTED] downstairs in the emergency room area. One side appeared to have orange marker writing with the numbers for Santiago and for mom. The other side, there was cursive writing that appeared to be English, almost like a love note but the handwritings appeared to be different in style. Also, we were advised by medical staff that they had her clothes still. All they had was a pair of blue jeans that according to medical staff was soiled and shoes. Also in the bag that they had for her property were shoelaces and a white phone cord charger. Additionally, a 100 peso bill and a \$5 peso coin were found in her jeans. We collected all those items for evidence.

NOTE: The blue jeans were still very wet and had a pungent odor of being soiled.

I spoke with Deputy Morales reference she had gone in to take photographs reference bruising on her arms and leg and the areas where she observed bruising or marks. I kept Sergeant Cervantez apprised of the information at this point. All we had was an unknown female who was on life support and according to

medical staff, her [REDACTED]. They were trying to change her status for the better but at the time, her prognosis was not good. Also, according to the information I got from hospital staff, when she was brought in, the subject who brought her in advised that he found her at River Road and La Cholla Boulevard on the side of the road, unresponsive and brought her in.

After clearing from ICU, we went down to the security office to make sure that security was able to get us video from the morning where she was brought into [REDACTED] Hospital to the information they had about a male subject coming to the hospital to ask for her or inquire about possibly her around 1700 hours. Deputy Morales used her department phone to take video for Axon. We were advised by security that they would have to order the tapes from their Human Resources Department to get copies of the video.

After that point, Deputy Morales and I responded back to the Foothills District Office where items taken for evidence were placed in. The only item that was not placed into evidence at the Foothills District Office were the jeans. The jeans were taken to the drying room at the Sheriff's Department Main station annex so they could dry. Photos were taken of all items of evidentiary value including the black tennis shoes, jeans, shoelaces, phone cord.

Also, while at the Foothills District Office, I attempted to make contact with the two phone numbers that I had at the time. The one for the husband, [REDACTED], was called. It was a number out of Florida. The phone call went straight to voicemail. No one picked up; however, the voicemail message was in Spanish. The other number appeared to have too many numerals, unknown if it was written down accidentally with too many numbers or if it was an out of country number. The [REDACTED] area code was out of Louisiana; however, following the [REDACTED], there were four numbers separated by four other numbers.

After clearing the Foothills District Office, the jeans were taken to the drying locker, Locker #1. After that point, I concluded my involvement in this incident at this time.

On 07/18/23, I was contacted just before 1200 hours by the Robbery/Assault Unit Sergeant G. J. Hernandez #1414, Detective S. George #1101, and Detective M. A. Durazo #7654.

Sergeant Hernandez, Detective George, and Detective Durazo were investigating the information and the case, reference the female at [REDACTED] Hospital who had not been identified. I briefed them on the information that I had. I was advised they were responding to [REDACTED] Hospital. Shortly after, I would be speaking with them to do follow-up. I gave them all the information that I had at the time, and my understanding of the female's condition.

Later on in the afternoon, I was contacted by Sergeant J. J. Brown #4289. I was asked to assist with follow-up in this case. After briefing him on the information that I had, I was asked to attempt to call a phone number that was given to Deputy A. G. Morales #8812, which I was not aware of at the time, for the sister who had called the previous day. She may have possibly been living in Georgia, according to the information from Deputy Morales. I was asked to see if I could make contact and get any information, and find out who this person was and if they had information on the female subject.

NOTE: There was a possible name associated with the female, which was [REDACTED]. That was discovered the previous day, but it was unsure if that was the sister's name or not. It was discovered that was the name that the person who brought her in believed the female's name was.

I responded to the Foothills District Office, where I called the number
*****.

I also contacted my supervisor prior to this, to advise him of the follow-up investigation I was conducting.

I was able to make contact via telephone at the Foothills District Office; however, the female on the other line only spoke Spanish. At that time, I told her I would call her right back.

I attempted to find a deputy to translate, so I could get information. Deputy A. M. Michel Jr. #8759 was able to assist me with translation.

I called the number back and spoke to the female. The female identified herself as the other female's sister, [REDACTED].

The following is a brief summary of the contact with [REDACTED], and should not be taken for all that is known about the case. For a complete recollection, please see a copy of the tape transcript.

I made contact with [REDACTED]. She advised that she had called her sister. She identified her sister by the name of [REDACTED], with a date of birth of

(DOB *****

It appeared that she had spoken to her sister this past Sunday, which was 07/16/23. When she was on the phone, her sister said her head hurt. Then her sister did not respond on the phone after that, even though [REDACTED] was calling her name.

[REDACTED] got a call a little bit later that [REDACTED] was going to be taken to the hospital. It appeared that she did not understand too much of what the male who had called her said. It appeared it was brief.

[REDACTED] advised that her sister, [REDACTED], was from Guatemala. She confirmed that her husband's name was [REDACTED], and that he lived in Florida. Her mother lived in Guatemala. She confirmed the mother's number as

*****,

which was the number written down on the paper recovered from [REDACTED] Medical Center that belonged to the female who was admitted.

[REDACTED] described her sister, and also advised she had not spoken to her sister in quite some time.

[REDACTED] was asking about her sister. I advised that her sister was being treated at [REDACTED] Hospital. She was thankful that she got information about her sister being treated. She stated that her sister walked up from Guatemala by herself, from what she understood, and that her sister's husband was in Florida. It appeared that was her final destination.

[REDACTED] also advised that [REDACTED] did not have any friends or family in Tucson or in Arizona. The only family members she had were in Guatemala, Florida, and [REDACTED] in Georgia.

Deputy Michel and I attempted to get a street address for Juana. However, it appeared that she had a hard time relaying what the street address was for her in Savannah, Georgia.

After getting the information from [REDACTED] I contacted the Florida number, to try to recontact the husband. The husband answered the phone. He was also

exclusively a Spanish speaker, so Deputy Michel assisted me with translation.

The following is a brief summary of the contact with the husband, and should not be taken for all that is known about the case. For the complete recollection, please see a copy of the tape transcript.

The husband identified himself as [REDACTED] with a date of birth of

(DOB *****

His phone number again was

*****.

He lived in West Palm Beach, Florida.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was his wife. He had been married to her since she was 18.

While speaking with [REDACTED] he advised that [REDACTED] came up from Guatemala. She was supposed to come to the United States to be with him. He stated that he had not heard from her, except for this past Sunday, and previously on Friday, 07/14/23. He was able to advise during my contact with him that [REDACTED] had a cell phone number, which was from Guatemala, of

*****,

and that her cell phone was a Samsung, but no other information.

[REDACTED] advised that on Friday, 07/14/23, he had spoken to [REDACTED] where she was in Altar, Mexico, waiting to cross. He advised that he paid \$3,000 in cash to the people that were going to cross her. They were traffickers, also known as the "coyotes." The plan was that she would get into the United States, and she would take an Uber from where she arrived at to Florida.

[REDACTED] advised that on Sunday, 07/16/23, during the afternoon in his time zone in Florida, he got a call from someone who he stated was a friend, or who was with Fabiana. The friend stated that she was not feeling good, and that they were leaving her behind. He stated that the information was that she was not feeling good because they did not have enough food or water.

I asked [REDACTED] if he had contact from the people he paid the \$3,000 to, to get Fabiana across the boarder. He stated no. He had not had any demands or contact with them since.

[REDACTED] stated that later on, at about 2200 hours in his time zone, he got a call from [REDACTED]. She advised that she was going to maybe stay a couple of days, to try to make some money and get some work, so she could get an Uber to

take her to Florida. That was the last time he spoke to her, at 2200 hours his time, reference her cell phone number.

I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] had any money on her, or anything else. He stated she had very little.

NOTE: In the evidence that was collected at the hospital from [REDACTED] jeans, there was a 100 peso bill, and a \$5 peso coin, along with all the other items collected.

I asked [REDACTED] if he had a picture of [REDACTED] and if he could sent it to me, which he did.

I advised [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] was being taken care of at the hospital. He was appreciative that she was being taken care of.

[REDACTED] gave me an address in Florida, and confirmed his phone number.

For any further information, please see a copy of the tape transcript.

NOTE: [REDACTED] never stated that [REDACTED] relayed she was in any type of trouble. He only relayed the information that she was not feeling well, that she was having headaches from not having enough food or water possibly during her trip, and that she was being left behind. He also advised that she had no family or friends in Tucson, and her only family was from Guatemala.

After hanging up the phone with [REDACTED], I made all advisories to supervisors, to include Sergeant Brown, Sergeant E. Cervantez #6537, and Sergeant Hernandez.

I also made contact with Detective Durazo, advising him of the information that I had. Detective Durazo advised he had already made contact with the sister, [REDACTED], earlier today, and that the sister had sent a picture. Deputy Durazo was able to send me that picture. I sent him the picture the husband had sent. It appeared to be the same person in both pictures. The pictures were different types of pictures, but the person in them was the same.

After that point, I made contact with Sergeant Hernandez and Detective George. I filled them in on the information that I had, and relayed the information that I had discovered from the husband, [REDACTED]. I was requested by Sergeant Hernandez to respond to the hospital, due to the information that the female had a damaged tooth, to confirm her identity not only visually with the picture but with the physical characteristics of the tooth. That way, we could confirm that this female was, from the information we had at this point, [REDACTED].

After that point, I advised my supervisor, Sergeant Cervantez, that I would be en route to [REDACTED] Hospital.

I responded to [REDACTED] Hospital, and went to the intensive care unit (ICU) on the second floor, in Room #20. I made contact with staff again, advising of the possible name and information for the patient, Fabiana, and the information on the sister and husband that we had.

The picture from both the sister and the husband matched the female in the ICU. She was still under protocol.

I asked the medical staff if they would check [REDACTED] teeth, reference a broken or rotted tooth in the area described by Sergeant Hernandez. They checked, and confirmed that there was a damaged or dead tooth in that area.

I gave Sergeant Hernandez information that the physical characteristic of the tooth was confirmed, and that the pictures matched the female in the ICU.

I was advised by medical staff that the edema to the back of the female's head and the bruising were documented. I was also advised that [REDACTED]; however, she was still under quarantine for a possible other type of infection. I was informed that her condition was still life-threatening at this point. Her chances of survival, according to medical staff at that time, were 50%/50%.

Based on the information I got, I informed medical staff that detectives would possibly be making contact or responding in the future as well. I also advised them at this point that, according to the information we had, the female had no family or friends in Tucson. I advised that if anyone came to the hospital other than law enforcement, and was asking about her or questioning for her, to try to get as much information from that subject as possible, and to document the time and date that they got either phone calls or in-person inquiries about her.

For [REDACTED] protection, the hospital advised that they would keep her as a Do No Announce.

After that point, I relayed the information to Sergeant Hernandez. I then cleared Northwest Hospital.

This concludes my involvement in this incident at this time.

On 07/18/23, I responded to

at [REDACTED] Hospital, to try to identify a patient who was brought in for a possible assault. Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Agent Carol-Anne Dowling #102056 was assisting me with a mobile biometrics application which is a fingerprint scan to try to identify the unknown female. There was no match as a result on the fingerprint scan. The unidentified female was in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) on the second floor of [REDACTED] Hospital. At that time we were unable to identify who she was.

I then went to the security office to try to obtain surveillance footage of the male who dropped her off at the hospital, as well as a guest who was seen on surveillance. I spoke with security director Antonio Jimenez. I requested a timeframe which he advised me that would be too much data and that I would need to subpoena the hospital for them to release the footage.

After speaking with Mr. Jimenez, I then left the hospital. I contacted Detective S. George #1101 to advise him, as he was assisting me with this investigation, that [REDACTED] Hospital was requesting subpoena for the surveillance footage. Detective George said he would work on getting a subpoena.

Later on in the evening, there was a phone number for a sister named Juana that Deputy A. G. Morales #8812 had put in report. I contacted the number of *****

, where I made contact with a female. She identified herself as Juana Ordoniez-Perez.

I asked [REDACTED] if she had a sister named [REDACTED] which she said she does have a sister name [REDACTED], but her real name was [REDACTED] and gave me the date of birth of (DOB *****

I advised her that she was in the hospital and we were investigating to see what happened with her and why she was in the hospital. She stated that her sister is from Guatemala and walked by herself to the United States where she was going to go to Florida to be with her husband, but decided to change her mind and go to Savannah, Georgia where [REDACTED] is.

She said she last spoke with her sister, [REDACTED] on Sunday, 07/16/23, in the

evening. She said that her sister, [REDACTED] told her that she had a bad headache and felt like she was going to pass out. She said the phone went silent at that time. [REDACTED] stated that she was yelling on the phone to try to get her sister's attention, but there was no communication back. She said she hung up and called multiple times and her sister, [REDACTED], did not answer and that was the last time she talked to her.

She stated later on she received a phone call by a Good Samaritan who said six words to her telling her he found her sister and took her to the hospital. [REDACTED] said she did not know where her sister's phone is and she thinks that when passed out, she may have lost it. I asked about the phone number that called her. She said she did not have it. It came in as a private number, but the Good Samaritan, who was a male, gave her the number to the hospital for her to contact the hospital.

I asked [REDACTED] if she could describe her sister and what she was wearing. She said her sister was wearing blue jeans, black shoes and she has long black hair and a damaged or bad tooth in the front middle by her nose. I asked her if she had a photo of [REDACTED] which she said she did. I provided her with my department cell phone number so she could send me a picture. I then sent the photograph to Detective E. K. Gieron #1255 who was also assisting me with this case.

She sent me the photo. I uploaded it to evidence.com. She said that photo is possibly a few months old and that [REDACTED] skin tone may be darker now because she walking in the desert. I asked her who the male was who came to check on her. She said she does not know who the male was. She said [REDACTED] does not have any family or cousins or friends in Tucson and that she was alone walking and everybody that she knows is in Georgia. I advised Ms. [REDACTED] that if I had any further questions, I would contact her and I ended my conversation with [REDACTED].

On 07/24/23, I went to follow up at [REDACTED] Hospital. I spoke with Registered Nurse, [REDACTED]. She advised me that [REDACTED] still cannot communicate. I could not conduct an interview with her. I went in and took photos to see the progression. She said she was doing better than when she came in, but she does have an infection and [REDACTED] and she was highly contagious. I noticed there was substantial bruising on her arms and I asked Nurse [REDACTED] if she is more likely to bruise easily due to her condition she was in which she said no. I thanked her and I cleared from the hospital.

I asked her if she passed out, which she nodded yes. I asked her if she was sick when she passed out. I did not see a

response. I asked her if anyone beat or hit her, which she responded, nodding no. I asked her if she was in a group, she nodded yes. I asked her if they left her, which she nodded no. I asked her if she went to a house, which she nodded yes. I asked her if she went to a house with a group, she nodded yes. I asked her if anyone hit her, which she nodded no. I asked her if she was scared, she nodded no. At that time, I observed her starting to no respond as well, so I stopped asking questions.

The information I received through my Mobile Data Computer (MDC) stated a caller called and advised that they were told they were not to give out any information on patient, [REDACTED], and that a female came in the his morning claiming to be with a Guatemala Consulate and she had a picture of the patient's identification and was asking about the patient's parents.

Before contacting the reportee by telephone number, I received the initial case and subsequent supplemental narratives to gather the circumstances surrounding the original case. I noted after the reviewing the case narratives, that the case had a closed status. I also viewed that Detective M. A. Durazo #7654 from the Robbery/Assault Unit appeared to be assigned the case as he had several follow up investigations.

After determining this, I contacted Detective Durazo by telephone and informed of the information for the supplement. Detective Durazo informed me that he recently closed the case and that he had attempted to make contact with a Guatemalan Consulate; however, he was unable to make direct contact with any representative from the Consulate and at that time had not had any contact back from a Guatemalan Consulate. Detective Durazo also confirmed with me at this time that the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) did not have any reason to prevent the dissemination of the information concerning the patient from the perspective of the [REDACTED] Hospital staff.

After conferring with Detective Durazo concerning this incident, I contacted the reportee at

Phone #*****.

She identified herself as [REDACTED] a nursing supervisor for the [REDACTED] Hospital. Nurse [REDACTED] informed me that at approximately 1100 hours, a female individual came into [REDACTED] Hospital inquiring about the female subject reference the original case. She stated that the female subject had initially

made contact with other staff members, but was eventually brought to Nurse [REDACTED] office.

Nurse [REDACTED] made contact with the female who only spoke Spanish. Through interpretation, Nurse [REDACTED] obtained the name of the individual who identified herself as [REDACTED]. She stated she did not show any official credentials as being a representative for the Guatemalan consulate. Nurse [REDACTED] stated that the female subject was wearing a vest with a patch but did not know what the patch said and was displaying some sort of identification badge, but Nurse [REDACTED] could not from her view point see what exactly what the name badge stated.

Phone #***** was the same phone number that Ms. [REDACTED] provided to Nurse [REDACTED] when she came in earlier today. After locating this information, I contacted Detective Durazo and informed him of my findings. Detective Durazo requested that information and relayed to me that he was going to contact the Guatemalan Consulate concerning the female patient and then after doing so would contact Nurse Harris.

After making this determination with Detective Durazo, I recontacted Nurse [REDACTED] by telephone and informed her of Detective Durazo's intentions. After doing so, I ended my conversation with Nurse [REDACTED] and returned to patrol duties.

The call text advised that a female was in the store throwing things and hitting the reportee. She is now outside the store and was telling the reportee, "Call the cops on me". They advised that she was alone and described the female as Hispanic, approximately 20 years of age, 5'03" tall, thin, wearing maroon scrubs. Advising that she looks like she just got out of jail. They advised that she was walking away on foot, but now on the property. They advised that she was not intoxicated or on drugs. The reportee was declining any medical attention, just advised that the female made a mess and was eating and drinking things in the store and did not pay for them.

I arrived at the location and looked around the store and did not locate a subject matching the description. Shortly after, I observed a female matching the description coming back onto the property, directly towards me. I was able to locate a name for [REDACTED] from a previous arrest with a photograph under Name # [REDACTED]. There was no information as far as driver's license or Social Security Number (SSN). Based on that, I did what she asked and contacted Border Patrol. I relayed the information to them and provided her name. An agent was able to arrive at the location.

Before Border Patrol arrived, I was able to make contact with the victim, who

identified herself as [REDACTED] who was a Circle K employee. She advised that the female entered the store and was throwing a lot of the merchandise around and causing a ruckus. Ms. [REDACTED] advised that she stood in front of the donut cabinet to prevent the female from gaining access to it and the female managed to grab a donut and hit her with it. She claimed no injuries and she believed that the female subject had some mental issues.

It was at that point that I made an advisory to Border Patrol to see if there were any units who could respond to the call. Communications had told me that there were no Border Patrol units in the area.

I asked [REDACTED] if I had his consent to check him for any weapons on his person, due to the fact that he started putting his hands in his pocket. [REDACTED] had given me consent to search him for weapons. At which point, I checked his waistband and pockets for any weapons and no weapons were found. I asked [REDACTED] for consent to check his backpack. [REDACTED] had given me consent to check his bags. Upon searching his bags, there was no contraband or weapons located in his bag.

It was then brought to my attention that [REDACTED] was not allowed to be walking on the highway. I advised [REDACTED] to walk on the Interstate 19 Frontage Road facing traffic and head northbound. Due to the fact that there was no suspicious activity or criminal activity. I put myself back into service.

This was the end of my involvement.

At approximately 0030 hours, on 10/17/23, while I was conducting traffic enforcement in the Ajo District in a fully marked patrol vehicle, I observed a Nissan Armada bearing the Arizona license plate of # [REDACTED]. It was driving northbound on State Route 85, Milepost #43. It was observed that the vehicle did not have an operable headlight on the passenger's side. Also, both of the taillights on the rear side were not working. As a result of that reason, a traffic stop was conducted at the intersection of South State Highway Route 85 and North Ajo Well Road.

The vehicle was occupied by a male driver, who was later identified as [REDACTED]

(DOB *****

I also observed two individuals were sitting in the rear passenger seat. When I asked [REDACTED] to roll down the window, I observed that those individuals were wearing normal and plainclothes; however, I observed pieces of bushes and debris around their pants. I also observed a black in color gallon of water sitting on the floorboard on the rear side of the vehicle. This was indicative of those two subjects potentially being undocumented aliens. Considering that South State Highway Route 85 had been known nationally as one of the smuggling corridors, I suspected that [REDACTED] was involved in the smuggling of illegal aliens into United States soil, at which point I immediately a Border Patrol agent to respond to our location. I asked [REDACTED] to step out of the vehicle.

Considering that it was not my job to ask any immigration related questions from [REDACTED] however, for the sake of my investigation, I asked [REDACTED] where he picked up those two individuals. [REDACTED] who sounded very deceptive, indicated that he came all the way from Phoenix to the south of Ajo. He was trying to test his vehicle because he recently bought it and he was doing donuts in the parking lot, and that was where he came across those individuals and he decided to give them a ride to Phoenix. That was a very odd statement to make by [REDACTED] however, I let him carry on with his story.

I asked [REDACTED] if there was anything illegal inside of the vehicle. He indicated no. He also indicated that he had some personal use "weed" in the middle console. I directed all of the individuals to step out of the vehicle. Considering that oftentimes illegal immigration came with the smuggling of narcotics, I decided to utilize my canine partner, Katja, for narcotic detection

on that vehicle. Prior to me using my canine partner, I asked [REDACTED] if he granted me consent to search the vehicle with my canine partner, and he granted me consent for an exterior and interior search of the vehicle.

I grabbed my canine partner, Katja. We proceeded around the vehicle approximately two times, allowing my canine partner to sniff all of the areas where the air was coming out, however, my canine partner did not alert to any side of the vehicle on the exterior. Since this was a consensual search, I allowed my canine partner to go through the vehicle's interior compartment from the rear passenger door. Canine Katja thoroughly sniffed all of the areas inside of the vehicle and did not present any alert inside of the vehicle. I then secured Katja in the back of my vehicle and simultaneously at that time, United States Border Patrol (USBP) agents arrived on the scene.

USBP agents conducted an immigration inspection on the subject and they determined that [REDACTED] was a United States citizen, and he was going to be placed under arrest for smuggling undocumented aliens into the United States. Also, the two other individuals were undocumented aliens. I stood by on scene to provide scene security for the Border Patrol agents, considering that it was at late hours, and they did not have enough staff on scene. Once they told me that they no longer needed my assistance, I cleared the scene and returned to service.

On 10/17/23 at 1001 hours, I observed a blue, 2004 Honda Civic, later found to bear Arizona temporary license plate [REDACTED] stopped on the north side of McGee Ranch Road, facing west. The vehicle was located west of the intersection of South Mission Road.

There were seven persons appearing to be dressed in various assortments of camouflage clothing. They fled from the vehicle. There were obvious indications that the vehicle was being used to smuggle humans. Specifically, there was a construction vest and a hard hat situated in visible areas of the vehicle; specifically in the back windshield of the vehicle. The vehicle also had little to no personal property located inside.

I contacted Communications and requested Border Patrol respond. I also requested that a tow truck respond, so that the vehicle could be towed in accordance with the mandatory immobilization statute, as the vehicle was involved in a human smuggling operation. Border Patrol Agents arrived and deployed their canine counterparts. Ultimately, the subjects were tracked and located.

I continued to stand by for the tow truck while completing a Vehicle Removal Report (VRR). A tow truck from Mobile Maintenance and Towing (MM&T) arrived on scene. The vehicle was transferred from my care and custody to that of MM&T. I later contacted Terminal Operations. The vehicle was entered in as mandatory immobilized. I departed from the area.

On 10/29/23 at approximately 0910 hours, I was dispatched to a suspicious person call reference the area of Valencia Road and Viviana Road, last seen heading westbound of that.

The information in given advised there was a Hispanic male, in his 20s, with an Edgar haircut, and wearing a burgundy hoodie and jeans, who was pointing a silver Glock at traffic. It was advised that the subject was on the south side of the road walking westbound. He appeared to be in distress, and he kept pointing the gun at cars, then putting it down, and he appeared to be on drugs. The reportee had seen the subject from the Casino Del Sol gas station.

Upon coming to the area, I did observe a male subject who matched the description, and he was jogging along with a second male subject beside him. It appeared initially that they were together. The main subject in question had a hoodie, but it was just around his neck, and he had a gray shirt on. He had the Edgar haircut, he looked to be Hispanic, and younger, and was wearing black pants. The second subject initially appeared to be darker skinned, possibly Hispanic, with a white shirt on. I kept an eye on him until I could get a second unit to try and make contact with the subject. Once the second unit got closer, the subject was at about South Arrow Road and Camino Verde. The one subject that had the white shirt on stayed at the cross streets of Camino Verde and Valencia Road. I then recognized him as being a regular walker on that path.

The subject in question continued jogging westbound coming near the cross street of South Arrow Road. At that point, Deputy E. A. Aguirre Ortega #8683 was heading westbound on Valencia Road. I was heading eastbound and had to make a U turn in order to get in front of the subject, which I then pulled over to the side of the road and initiated my overhead lights. I could see that the subject did not have anything in his hands. And I had gotten information from the reportee that it did not seem like the subject pointed it at anybody directly. It was just pointed kind of towards traffic, and towards the desert area, and kind of up in the air.

I advised the male individual that we needed to speak with him. He said something to the effect as to why, and then continued walking past my vehicle. He eventually started running away from us once he got past Deputy Aguirre Ortega. He continued running westbound on the path initially, then diverted off of it. He jumped the barbed wire fence and took off heading southbound. Instead of chasing the individual through the desert area where there is absolutely no

cover and him potentially having a firearm, we decided to back off and try and deploy small unit tactics, which we tried to place quadrants around the area. We did have help from the Border Patrol Air Units to try and locate the subject, but we were not successful in doing so.

We did get ahold of Pascua Yaqui Police Department (PYPD) as well to see if they had any information that they may be working a call themselves. They did advise us that they were working a shooting which involved three subjects, one of whom was still at large. The area which they advised where it had occurred was within close proximity. They advised that there were no injuries there. They provided me with the case number of #P23102908. They also did not have any information on the subject who had fled. That was all the information that they could provide. We advised them and gave them the information on the subject who had run from us.

After checking the area thoroughly, we were not able to locate him, and we cleared shortly after. Sergeant C. M. Gibson #5165 was on scene.

The following supplement is in reference to case 231107072

Narrative: On 11/07/2023 at approximately 0920 hours while working as a member of the Criminal Interdiction Unit I was traveling northeast on W Ajo Highway in the direction of Tucson. As I did so I noted a white Ford truck bearing AZ license plate [REDACTED] was traveling directly in front of my fully marked patrol vehicle in the same direction. As the truck and I approached a group of vehicles traveling in the same direction I noted the white Ford truck approach and drive at less than a safe distance from the vehicle directly in front. The Ford truck was traveling at approximately 65 mph which is the maximum speed for this portion of W Ajo Highway. The Ford truck was only 1-2 car lengths from the vehicle in front which was insufficient for stopping distances at this speed.

I initiated a traffic stop by engaging my emergency lights at which time the Ford truck pulled to the right and stopped. Upon approaching the vehicle I could see the driver who appeared to be a Hispanic male. I greeted the driver and immediately noted a younger Hispanic male wearing camouflage crouched down between the front passenger seat and dash area. As this was very odd I attempted to speak to this individual but he did not appear to understand or respond. CIU Task Force/USBP Agent F. Moreno had stopped out at the stop indicated verbally he had located five additional camouflaged individuals trying to conceal themselves in the rear seat area of the truck. I recognized these as indicators of human smuggling and removed the driver, later identified as John [REDACTED], from the truck where he was detained into handcuffs. [REDACTED] was checked for weapons before being sat in the rear of my patrol vehicle. [REDACTED] was sat with his legs out of the door area and the door left open as he stated he suffered from an auto-immune disorder which limited the use of his legs.

[REDACTED] was provided Miranda Admonitions read directly from a PCSD issued card and acknowledged his understanding verbally. [REDACTED] stated this was first time he had transported people from the border area northbound. He stated that he had been contacted by a person he believed lived in Mexico and driven to an area where he picked up six people who were waiting. [REDACTED] stated that he was headed to Tucson where he would call this person to get further instruction where to take those he had picked up. [REDACTED] advised he would be paid \$1000. for transporting these individuals.

BP Agent Moreno took custody of [REDACTED] for charges related to human trafficking and additional U.S. Border Patrol personnel responded to take custody of two females and four males located within the truck. All advised that they were from Guatemala. [REDACTED] was provided with a copy of a PCSD Written Warning for his following distance (A.R.S. 28-730). Criminal Interdiction Unit (CIU) supervisor Sgt. C. Kennedy #6539 was on scene and stood by for a U.S. Border Patrol

dispatched tow vehicle to remove the Ford truck. Once all persons involved had been transported from the area of the stop I cleared from the area without further involvement.
