On 01/15/2025 at 1123 hours, I responded to a suspicious person at Acacia Elementary School, located at

Call text advised that there was a male subject standing in the school parking lot. He was described as 5'4"- 5'6" wearing all black with a hoodie, and a black face mask. The male was last seen walking northbound from the school on Colossal Cave Rd, reportee said that school is aware.

I found the described male at Success Rd and Colossal Cave Rd and pulled over to initiate a consensual contact. The male was compliant and I noticed a boxcutter in his pocket, which he allowed me to hang onto until our contact was up, he also took off his backpack. He then asked if I spoke Spanish, in which I don't but Deputy E. Molina #6320 arrived and was able to speak with him. The male did understand me with the minimal questions I asked, and consented to me going into his bag for his wallet for identification. He also consented to a search of his bag. In his wallet I found a passport and Mexican driver's license identifying him as [REDACTED]. There was also two knives within the bag, as well as multiple food items, and \$83 dollars in cash.

Deputy Molina told me that he works out of Phoenix for a furniture company, which would explain his boxcutter and knives. [REDACTED] brother needed to go to Sierra Vista but [REDACTED] did not want to go through the checkpoint, as he admitted he is undocumented. His brother was on his way to come pick him back up, but in the mean time he was walking around because he got cold and stopped momentarily in the parking lot of the school.

I contacted Border Patrol with his information, who instructed that was in the application process of citizenship and they would not take custody of him. I had Deputy Molina tell him to find an area to stay warm until his brother could pick him up, and to not hang out on a school campus. [REDACTED] understood and I returned his items and placed all knives in his backpack. This concludes my involvement, NFI.

On January 15, 2025 at approximately 1122 hours while on patrol in the Vail District I responded to the area North of Acacia Elementary School In reference to a a suspicious person.

The call text stated that a male was standing around the school parking lot with a mask, possibly headed North bound and possibly carrying a backpack.

On my arrival another Deputy was already on scene and had consent to search the individual's bag. Upon searching the bag multiple knives were found in addition to a passport. I stood by as scene security while other Deputies on scene conducted their investigation. When my services were no longer needed I returned to my normal patrol duties in the Vail District.

NARRATIVE:

On 01/15/25, at approximately 1122 hours, I responded to a call reference a suspicious person at the Acacia Elementary School which was located at

While en route, Communications updated information indicating that the subject was now walking northbound from the school. I later heard Deputy C. N. Bradley #8512 state over the radio that she was out with the male subject.

Upon arrival to the location, Deputy J. Munoz #9804 was also out with Deputy Bradley. When I walked up to where the deputies were at with the male subject, I was approached by Deputy Bradley. She advised me that the male did not speak any English and only spoke Spanish.

I made contact with the male subject later identified as [REDACTED] via passport. All of my contact with Mr. [REDACTED] was in Spanish. I asked him what was going on and what he was doing here today. He stated that he was waiting for his brother, whom he verbally identified as [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] was going to pick him up.

While I was speaking to Mr. [REDACTED], Deputy Bradley wanted to know if we could search his backpack since he mentioned to Deputy Bradley that there were weapons inside. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if it was okay if we searched his backpack. He stated yes.

I asked Mr. [REDACTED] what he was doing at the school. He stated he was waiting for his brother. I asked him where his brother was at. He stated his brother was in Sierra Vista and was on his way to pick him up. Mr. [REDACTED] continued and told me that he and his brother worked for a furniture company called Living Spaces and there was a delivery to be made in Sierra Vista, Arizona.

Due to Mr. [REDACTED] not having "papers" as he said and there being a Border Patrol checkpoint on the way, Mr. [REDACTED] was left here in Vail while the delivery was made in Sierra Vista. After the delivery, Mr. [REDACTED] brother, [REDACTED], was not pick him up and go back to Phoenix which was where they both lived at and

where they worked for this furniture company.

I then explained to Mr. [REDACTED] the reason we were out with him making contact since he was wearing a mask over his face and a backpack sitting in the school parking lot. He understood that that might appear suspicious to other people. He stated he was wearing the mask because it was cold. There were three knives recovered from the backpack and Mr. [REDACTED] stated those were his tools which he used to cut open boxes and stuff to make the delivery for the furniture. Within these knives there was one box cutter. Mr. [REDACTED] told me he lived in Phoenix with his wife and his family at

and also provided me with his cell phone of

Phone #*****.

I observed Mr. [REDACTED] was wearing clean clothes and had not appeared that he had just been walking in the desert. He also had with him some working gloves with a grip texture to them. I passed that information to Deputy Bradley. There was no probable cause to charge Mr. [REDACTED] with any crime and it was decided that he would be released. I told him to walk over to the McDonald's which was within walking distance and buy himself a drink and wait there for his brother, which he called and was 15 minutes away.

After I cleared from the scene, I remained nearby and I later observed a box truck similar to the ones used by furniture companies traveling toward the McDonald's shopping plaza. I observed that on the sides of the truck, it had a company name of Living Spaces as well as pictures of furniture.

This concludes my involvement with this case.

SYNOPSIS:

Case #250131026 resulted in a report made by K [REDACTED] D [REDACTED]. She stated on Wednesday 01/29/25, her ex-boyfriend, whom she identified as [REDACTED] at approximately 2000 hours on 01/29/25, had arrived at her residence and began banging on the door, telling her: You better open the door, or I will. At that point, he was able to kick the screen door, and was able to force entry on both the screen door, and the wooden door, and gained entrance.

At that point, he placed his left hand around her neck, and held down her arms with his right hand. Ms. D [REDACTED] stated it was difficult to breathe; however, she did not feel that she could not breathe, and she did not lose consciousness.

Ms. D [REDACTED] stated at a later point, he had pulled out a pocket knife and made suicidal threats, and told her: You're gonna watch what happens, what I do to myself, before undressing her out of her pajamas she had been wearing, and taking her to the bedroom, where he got her completely naked and got completely naked himself. He attempted to have sex with her. She stated she told him multiple times, she did not want to have sex with him. Although Intercourse did not occur, but he tried multiple times, before leaving the residence.

Ms. D [REDACTED] also stated she had received bruises on her right breast, from where he had been pulling on a nipple piercing that she had, causing bruising.

An AXON evidence link was sent to Ms. D [REDACTED]; however, no evidence has been uploaded at this time, as she stated she had video of the outside incident, as well as video surveillance inside the house. She also stated that her cell phone had been damaged by Mr. [REDACTED]

NARRATIVE:

On 01/31/25, at approximately 0639 hours, I made telephonic contact with K [REDACTED] D [REDACTED] in reference to a separated domestic trouble call.

The call text stated [REDACTED] came to the house and forcibly went in. He grabbed onto the reportee, Ms. [REDACTED], and broke her phone. He

was making threats because of the break-up. She stated she had video surveillance of everything.

I made telephonic contact with Ms. [REDACTED], who stated on 01/129/25, at around 2000 hours, she had come home from the gym. She also stated that she and her ex-boyfriend, identified as [REDACTED], had recently broken up in November of 2024, and were not currently living together at this time.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated he was a jealous man and had constantly been calling her.

She stated when she got home at around 2000 hours, she heard her doorbell ring, and there was knocking on the window. She stated she heard him yelling: You better open the door, or I will, on the camera. At that point, she spoke to him through the video camera outside of the residence, telling him to leave. She stated he began kicking the security door, and was able to open the security door, forcing entry into the house. She stated the inner door could be opened, because the lock did not secure all the way, and he was able to pry open the door to gain access.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated the argument started when there was a picture of a mutual friend they had, whom he accused her of seeing, after breaking up with him. She stated Mr. [REDACTED] was intoxicated, and after forcing entrance into the residence, he pushed her on the couch and then grabbed her neck. She stated he smelled of intoxicants.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated he grabbed her neck with his left arm, and used his right arm to pin her arms to her body. She stated she started crying, and he was yelling about the break-up they had.

She stated at one point, he had a box cutter that was red and black, that he often used for work. He pulled it out and had taken off his sweater and his shirt, and started to make suicidal threats. He told her: You're gonna watch what happens to me.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated the incident where he had his hand on her neck, was approximately about eight minutes, before releasing her, while she was still on the couch. During that time, he also told her: I hope you said goodbye to your kids, because this is the last time you're going to be alive.

Mr. [REDACTED] then told Ms. [REDACTED] they were going to the bedroom to have sex, and she told him she did not want to. She stated she had been wearing pajamas, and Mr. [REDACTED] had taken her pajamas off of her, and he took her to the room, and she stated she did not want to. When he went into the bedroom,

he had also broken her cell phone, so at that point she was unable to call anybody.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated once in the bedroom, he began to undress her until she was completely naked, and he got completely naked himself. He laid on top of her, attempting to have sex with her. She stated she was able to keep him from having intercourse with her, and no intercourse had occurred; however, multiple times, he had tried, and she told him no, and was able to fend him off.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated she has nipple piercings and he began twisting the nipple piercings, telling her: You're gonna feel what pain feels like. She stated while he was twisting the piercings, she began to cry, and he was yelling at her during the incident.

When I asked Ms. [REDACTED] about injuries from the incident, she stated she had bruising on her hands, as well as her right breast had a bruise from the twisting of the nipple piercings.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated when she tried to defend herself, or talk to him, it would escalate the situation, and he would get more angry and hurt her further. She said she was able to calm him down enough, to try to talk to him, and that was when he left the residence.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated she had found an old cell phone, and was able to get the SIM card, and that was why she called the Sheriff's Department today.

I asked for more information on Mr. [REDACTED]. She gave me a cell phone number of

and stated he works construction; however, she was not sure where he was currently employed. She stated he had been fired from a previous job at Pima Pool Plastering, but she was unsure if he went back to that company.

Ms. [REDACTED] stated Mr. [REDACTED] lived between the crossroads of Nogales Highway and Park Avenue, between Drexel Road and Irvington Road; however, she was unsure of the address at that time. She stated he lived with his father, [REDACTED], who was approximately 46 to 47 years of age.

A Victim's Rights Pamphlet was sent to her Email. I provided her with the case number, my name and badge number. I sent her an AXON evidence link, as she stated she had security surveillance inside the residence and outside the residence, that would show Mr. [REDACTED] during the incident.

Ms. [REDACTED] also stated she would take photos of her hands, as well as her right breast, for the injuries and the bruising; however, at this time, no evidence has been uploaded of the incident, and I am still waiting to get the evidence uploaded.

The domestic violence Form 4(c) was filled out and submitted; however, Ms. [REDACTED] stated she did not want the questions submitted to Emerge! Center Against Domestic Abuse.

I filled out the basic strangulation questions with Ms. [REDACTED], and I asked her the following:

Question: Did you have any difficulty breathing while he had been strangling you?

Answer: A little bit

Question: Could you not breathe, or was it just difficult to breathe?

Answer: It was difficult.

Question: Did you have any other feelings while being strangled?

Answer: I was scared, and I feared for my life. She said she left to a friend's after the incident, and did not stay at her residence, because of the incident.

Question: Did you feel dizzy?

Answer: I did not. She also stated she did not feel light-headed.

Question: What were your physical reactions to being strangled?

Answer: I tried to talk, to stop him, and also defend herself.

Question: What were your emotional reactions to being strangled?

Answer: I was scared.

Question: Sometimes during high stress situations people have different reactions, with one of those not being able to control their bladder. Did you experience anything like that?

Answer: No

Question: Do you have any painting on her neck?

Answer: A little bit, on the left side.

Question: Did it hurt to swallow?

Answer: No

Question: Did you have those marks on your neck before he strangled you?

Answer: No

Question: Did he say anything while strangling you?

Answer: While he was strangling me, he accused me of being with someone else, and asked why I was not with him. He said: You're not gonna live anymore.

Question: Has he ever strangled you before?

Answer: Yes, two times.

Question: Is there anything else about this experience that feels important, that I have not asked you?

Answer: No

At this time, I was unable to make contact with Mr. [REDACTED], and Ms. [REDACTED] stated she did not know his current address, but that he lived with his father, and so I was unable to get Mr. [REDACTED] side of the story.

There was no evidence uploaded at this time.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE:

Narrative:

I reviewed the case report as well as the surveillance of the case that was submitted by the victim [REDACTED]. In the driveway video, there is a white Dodge passenger car in the driveway belonging to the victim. A car is viewed coming from the right onto the property and stops in the dirt area near the house. The car is then turned off and someone exits the vehicle from the driver's side.

In the back door camera, a male wearing a hat, long-sleeved shirt, and pants goes to the back door of the property bangs on it, and then makes demands in Spanish stating to open the door, or he was going to do it himself.

In the doorbell camera, he is seen speaking to the camera and pointing towards the front door. In the video, the front door is a few feet from a security door to the property. He then kicks the screen door with his foot grabs the door handle and can be seen using force to pull it open. He then makes his way to the front door and tries to push it open but there appears to be an obstruction and he uses his body weight to force his way inside. At that point in time, you can hear a female cry out in Spanish.

There were 8 video recordings of the victim's bedroom. The first video time stamped for 1/29/25 at 20:44:02. [REDACTED] is fully nude with only socks on the bed and on lying her back with the male over her only wearing underpants and socks. He then hooks under her knees to position her closer to the edge of the bed in the middle and then stands up and removes his underwear. He then forced her legs open and positioned his body over hers with his body between her legs. He was then using both of his hands to hold her head and he was speaking to her in Spanish. The video ends at 20:45:37

Second video at 20:52:10, The victim is laying on her back with her hands covering her breast with the male still over top of her, he then pulls her hands away to expose her breasts. He then holds down both of her arms and places his mouth over her right breast. He then proceeded to kiss her neck and tried kissing her lips. She tried using her body and legs to get him off of her so he used his left arm and hooks it under her left leg and hold down her right arm. He then proceeds to hold control of her left arm. She tell him in Spanish that he was hurting her and to stop, but he then proceeds. Video ends at 20:54:22.

Third video at 21:07:03, The female is still lying on her back and the male is on top of her holding on to both of her breasts. It appears that he is twisting them, and she is crying and trying to remove his hands which causes him to be more aggressive. The video ends at 21:08:46.

Fourth video at 21:08:37, the victim is still lying on her back with the male over her. He appears to be talking softly and there is no movement. The video ends at 21:08:59.

Fifth video at 21:27:15, the victim is lying on her back and the male has moved alongside her and is facing her but is still straddled between her legs. He then uses his right hand and hits the left side of her

thigh, and she yells out in pain. He then yells at her in Spanish. He then hits her three more times and then gets back on top of her. She then tries to cover her breasts again and he uses his hands to force her arms away. He then grabs her by both of her nipples and would not let go and tries to kiss her lips. She tries to kick him away and since she did not reciprocate, he uses his left hand and starts twisting on her nipple as she yells out in pain. He refused to release her for over two minutes as she told him repeatedly to stop. The video then ends at 21:29:18.

Sith video at 22:02:03, the victim is lying on her back with her hand over her right breast. The male is now sitting back but still maintains control of her legs keeping them open. She is still crying, and he is speaking to her in Spanish. After some kind of discussion, she is trying to cover her breast and he again gets control of her arms, and she can kick him away momentarily. He gets on top of her and straddles her and she then tries turning her body to protect herself as he continues to grab at her. He then thrusts his right knee directly into her vagina. The video ends at 22:04:16.

Seventh video at 22:14:31, the Victim is lying on her back with the male still over her and she is trying to over her breast. They are talking and at 22:15:39, the male gets up grabs his pants, and removes his belt. The victim tried getting away from him and he got back on top of her, and he tried putting the belt loop onto her right wrist. She continued to yell out to him no and to stop because she needed to "pee". She tries to get up but he puts his weight on her and can put the strap around her left wrist and then around her right wrist. But she got her left arm free. The video ends at 22:16:37.

Eighth video at 22:16:32, the victim is still crying out that she needs to pee and he has the belt around her right wrist. She continues to call out and cry and then he removes the belt and throws it onto the floor. He then allows her to get up and then she goes into the bathroom he follows her and continues to speak to her at the doorway. The video then ends at 22:18:14.

I then reviewed the other items uploaded into the case were photographs of the victim that she had taken of herself. She had bruising on both breasts and her right nipple. Neck arms and legs. She also had a photo of a broken cell phone.

I then reviewed the Deputy report where the victim identified the suspect as her ex-boyfriend, [REDACTED] DOB *****.

I called Ms. [REDACTED] to get more information from her. The following is a brief summary of the conversation which was recorded for further review.

I asked her if she knew currently where [REDACTED] was. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she thought that he might be at his father's residence, but she did not know the address, but it was somewhere near Park and Drexel. She stated his father's name was [REDACTED].

I went over their history together and asked if they had been together for a while. I also mentioned to her how I had seen she had an order of protection against him back in 2020. Ms. [REDACTED] stated they were together for five years, on and off I confirmed that they had recently broken up in November of 2024. She stated that was correct.

I asked what their interactions been between November to when everything happened on the 29th. She stated they were civil. And they would talk, and they would message each other, but they were civil. And recently he was trying to get back together, but she told him no, and let's just leave it how it is. But They kept it civil up until that day when he showed up on the 29th and he was drinking because she could smell it. I asked if he just come out of the blue or if she had some kind of indicator that he was going to head to her house. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that he kept calling her and she wouldn't answer. And she had no idea that he was going to show up because she had just got home from the gym that day. And made it home at like around 19:55. And then by eight o'clock he was already at her house.

I advised her that I noticed there were no time stamps on her exterior cameras. But had confirmed with her that it was around eight o'clock? She confirmed that it was around eight o'clock. She got home from the gym and was changing her clothes. And then that's when she heard the doorbell ring and then she heard someone knocking on her window.

He went back to the front door, and since she didn't open it, she thought he waited less than a second. And then he went to her backyard, jumped her wall, and then started knocking her my window. And that's where the other footage you can see right there where he's knocking because she has security windows things on.

I asked her how long she had had cameras on her property. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she had been at that property for almost a year and a half to two years. And had installed them maybe a couple of weeks after she had moved in. I asked about the interior cameras in her bedroom and whatnot, and if she had any other cameras in the house. Ms. [REDACTED] advised she has cameras all over her house. I then asked if the cameras captured any other interactions with him on those cameras. She stated she did not and the only thing that it did not capture was the moment when he came in into her living room. She didn't know why the camera in her living room did not capture anything. But she looked back and was trying to look back and see if you knew why it didn't record. But it did record the front door. And then she was able to record the one in the bedroom because the ones in my living room and the outside are "Vivid" cameras. And then the ones in my bedroom and her kid's bedrooms are "Ring" cameras.

I then asked if anybody else was home when the incident happened. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she did not, and she was by herself. I then asked if he knew her children's custody schedule. She stated he did Yes, and she did not have her kids. She said she didn't have her kids from every other weekend, from Wednesday to Monday after school.

I confirmed with Ms. [REDACTED] that he didn't have a key to the house, and that was why he kicked the door and whatnot. She confirmed that he did not have a key. I then asked when he managed to get through the screen door in the front. And when he got to the primary door there. I asked if he forced that open or, did she had opened it. Ms. [REDACTED] stated he forced it open, and she was trying to push it back, so he was not able to open it, but he was able to still get in.

I then asked if they ended up in the living room. And asked her to explain step by step so I could paint the picture of what occurred. She stated they were there from eight o'clock up until like 11 something when he had taken off.

Ms. ■■■ stated the first thing that happened was she was telling him, "What are you doing here? Leave, there's no need for you to be here. Like, we're not together". And then he's like "Who you been talking to?" And this and that. She stated the whole issue started over a picture. And then he got so jealous that he thought that she was with somebody else. But even if she was or not. It's none of his business because they are not together.

Ms. ■■■ stated he was basically saying all this in Spanish stating "Who the fuck are you fucking? And this and that, like, you know, I know you're fucking somebody else". And then after that, he went straight into her room. He went to go get her phone, and then told him, you're not getting my phone. And said to give back her phone. He then took it off the charger and then he put it in his back pocket. She tried to close the door so he could give her back the phone. He then pushed her away. And then he made her go back into the living room. He then grabbed her with his arm against her neck and just held her against the couch. That's where he had her. And then he is like, "You know, you're not gonna be with anybody else." He did accuse her of cheating and being with somebody else. And she stated " We're not together. Like, what, what's wrong with you?" And then he said, "Well, I hope he has said goodbye to your kids because this is the last time you're gonna see them. This is the last time, you know, you know, by the time you tried to call the cops and this and that". She stated he wasn't able to do anything because he had her phone. So after he did all that, he slammed her phone, which broke her phone, which she sent pictures of. I asked her where he had broken her phone. She stated it was while they were in the living room.

Ms. ■■■ continued that after he took it. And then he had her against the couch. He had a pocketknife. She described that it was kind of like those knives that you used to cut cardboard, boxer cutter. And then he said, " Before you try to do anything, I'm gonna kill you and then I'm gonna kill myself". He then took off his sweater, he took off his shirt, and then he said, "You're gonna see what I'm gonna do". She stated he has always threatened her about saying that if she wasn't with him, that she wasn't gonna be with anybody else.

I asked Ms. ■■■ when he was holding the knife, where the knife at. She responded that it was, it was towards her, and he was pointing it at her. He was saying to her, "I'm gonna do something to you. I'm gonna kill you". And then he moved it back a little bit and then he put it in his pocket. I don't know what he did it for sure, but he was still holding her against the couch. She asked him to let her go. And he was hurting her neck. She even told him "You're hurting me". And then he responded, "Well if you keep moving then I'm gonna hurt you more". And then he took off her clothes in the living room, and then he wanted to have sex. He then took her to the bedroom and that's where he started doing everything else. And then pulling on the piercings that she has.

I then redirected Ms. ■■■ to speak about the knife. I asked while he was holding her down with one arm if he had the other knife in the other arm and he was holding her. She responded, "Yeah, because he said, because if any, any move that I tried to make or any, if I kept crying more, telling him to let me go. he said he was gonna hurt me more."

I then asked how that made her feel when that happened. Ms. ■■■ responded " I was scared of him. I, I'm like, I'm scared of him. 'cause he's like, you don't know me. You don't know who you've been

messing with. Like, you know, like he, that's how he gets when every time he would drink, he would get so violent. He would get like aggressive. That's the only reason why we're not together because of that same reason."

I then asked her to start from where he took her clothes off in the living room. She continued and said that he took her pants off. When they went into the bedroom, he took everything else off. He was trying to have intercourse and she told him no. And then at that point, he was begging her, and then telling her, "Well, you open your legs for somebody else, how come you don't open your legs for me and this and that? And then I was like, okay, if you're gonna do it, do it. But he didn't, he didn't do it. He was just like talking about like saying, well, you're fucking somebody else and why aren't you like doing anything with me? And basically like, I wanted you to be with me. And I told him, you're obsessed. Like you're, you're crazy. Like, this is the reason why we're not together."

I mentioned to her that I noticed in the video, that he pulled a belt off of his pants and he tried to tie you up with that. I asked if that was something that he'd tried to do with you in the past, even in a consensual matter. Ms. [REDACTED] stated "Not, not, not to the point where like, he's done it in the past, but every time he gets mad and I don't do what he wants me to do at that point. Because in that video right there, when he did the belt, I was telling him, I need to use the bathroom. I need to go pee. I need to go pee."

I asked her again. When they did have consensual sex, did he use a belt like that before on her? She responded "No". I then asked if he would tie her down or anything. She again stated "No. No. Not if we would have sex. Like normal sex? Like Yeah. When we were good. No. No, we never used anything like that when we were, we were Okay."

I then went on to ask her about the pinching and grabbing at her piercings on her nipples. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that he was trying to pull them, and he was trying to rip them from her nipples. I asked if he had done anything like that prior in the past. Ms. [REDACTED] said she only had the piercings for maybe a couple of months. Then she re-pierced them again. But No, he's never done that in the past but he's pushed her before, he's slapped her before. And that was the first argument years ago when we did was I did slap him once, but that was it. And he returned it to me. That was the very, very first time. But that was like she said, years ago, and then after that, it was just like every time he drinks, that's how he gets.

I asked her if she called the police on him before. Ms. [REDACTED] stated No because she would just tell him to leave, and to leave her alone. But she did years ago get an order of protection when she was living at a different house and they had broken up and she started dating somebody else and he saw that that person had left luggage of his at the house and he broke into my house, he made a whole mess on that day.

I went back to what had occurred in her bedroom and that he forced her into the bedroom, then took her clothes off. And that she stated he never penetrated her. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that was correct. I then asked if he had done anything else to her vagina or anything. Ms. [REDACTED] stated, "He just touched, he put his penis around there and then, you know, he did try to have intercourse, but I was like, you know, trying to tell him to No, no." I asked if he was trying to push his penis inside her vagina. She responded "Yeah, he was, he was trying to, but I had told him no."

I asked her if he complied with that. She stated, "No. There, there was a, there was a, a, a small second that he did try to put it in, but he didn't. He took it out."

I then asked how many times he tried to put it inside of her. She responded, "Maybe like, like three, four times."

I then asked her about how he was also kissing on her face and her neck. And if he had kissed her anywhere else? She stated he did it on both of her breasts and he did that twice. And then he was trying to leave marks on her boobs too. I asked how he did that. She said it was by giving her Hickey's and then he was also twisting at her nipples on her piercings both breasts. She said he did that multiple times. She said she was telling her, "If you got the piercings, you got 'em for a reason. So I'm gonna show you what it feels like to have them ripped, you know, away. And, and so he was basically threaten me to like, rip them from my nipples"

Advised her that I noticed at one point in time in the video he was whispering to her or talking very softly. And if she knew what I'm talking about? She stated she could not remember because he was just basically saying all kinds of stupid things at that moment.

I asked if he had made any other threats about killing her or anything like that? Ms. [REDACTED] stated, "Yeah, he has. Yeah. And then he also threaten about killing himself because taking the kids. Right. You know, life, life doesn't matter anymore since he's not with me and this and that like, you know, and he's like, you don't know who you mess with. He was just basically, you know, saying mostly about like, oh yeah, you know, you're opening your legs for somebody else and, and you know, you're, how come you're not with me? He's like, he, he kept repeating himself."

I then asked her if he touched her anywhere else. She stated he did not.

I then asked what eventually made him stop. Ms. [REDACTED] said "So every time that if I would cry. If I would cry or if I would try to defend myself, he would tell me, you need to stop or I'm gonna fucking hurt you more. That's what he would say. Right. So then I tried to keep myself calm to not, you know, escalate anything. And then I told him at that point like, you know, can you please just leave me alone? Like, I don't want to be with you. Like, can you just like, like, you know, think about what you're doing. And then I don't know at that point what happened that he just like got up, sat down for a little bit and then he said, yes, I know, um, you know, I got obsessed with you and this and that. And then he just started putting his clothes back on."

Asked what happened then what did you do after they got dressed? Ms. [REDACTED] stated she was arguing with him saying, "You know, how come you broke my phone and this and that? And then he's like, you're more worried about the fucking phone than, than us and this and that. And then I was like, well, yeah, 'cause I mean, I need my phone. Like I had important things on my phone. And he's like, you know, he tried to offer to supposedly pay for it, but I'm like, no, like, you know, you need to, you need to like, you know, I was, I was actually asking him like, why did you do it? And he said, because you're talking to other people. So that's supposedly what made him get all upset and then break my phone."

I asked if he left after that conversation. Ms. ■■■ said he left after that he grabbed two of his jackets that she had in the closet and then he took off. I asked what time that was when he left, and she said it was around 23:30.

I asked what she did after that. Ms. ■■■ then stated she packed her clothes then stayed with a friend because she did not know if he would come back. I then asked why she waited to make a report. She said it was because she did not want to use her friend's phone or get her involved.

I then asked if she knew where he was working. She stated she did not know if he was working or not. But he was working with whoever needed help from different companies.

I then asked if he was a US citizen. She stated that he was not. And she was not sure if he had a work visa or a green card. on a green card or anything? She said she was not sure.

I asked if she had his cell phone number. She stated she did and it was *****.

I then asked if he had tried to contact her since this had occurred. She stated he had not and she had blocked his number. I then asked if she had plans to place an order of protection against him until he was found. She stated she hasn't had time to go ahead and do that because of work and by the time she gets out from work, she doesn't make it in time.

I advised her to call me if she has any further details or if she hears from him.

I then contacted the United States Border Patrol and provided them with the suspect's information. They confirmed that he was in the United States Illegally and was not here on any permits, visas, or green cards.

An arrest warrant is to be issued in the near future for multiple felony charges.

I then responded to the area of 1st Ave. and Minorka Rd. and began surveilling [REDACTED] mother's house. A short while later, Dep. Metz #8594 of the K9 Unit advised that he saw a male matching [REDACTED] description, on Ruthrauff Rd., just west of I10. I quickly made my way to that area and picked up Dep. Metz and his K9 partner Ryder and they got into the back of my unmarked truck. We then relocated the same male near Chucks Trucks, which is located at *****

[REDACTED]. It would later be confirmed by other Detectives in the area that the male was in fact [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was helping another unidentified male with loading some tires into the back of a white Ford truck. On 03-06-25 at approximately 1840hrs I stopped out on a traffic stop with Det. McNeely at Kleindale Rd. and Howard Rd. Once out with him he advised he had a male detained in the back of his patrol truck. Moments later I was requested by Det. McNeely to stop out with a vehicle that was leaving the area from a location his team had been working. He advised that they had probable cause to stop the vehicle leaving, and any occupants in the vehicle could be removed from the vehicle and detained immediately. The vehicle was described as a gray Chevrolet Malibu.

Det. McNeely then informed me that he just received word the Malibu had just left and was headed south on Richie Rd. I proceeded down Rickie and found the vehicle parked in the corner market parking lot at Richie Rd. and Ft. Lowell Rd. There was a female at the driver door and she began walking away from the vehicle.

I called her over and immediately placed her into handcuffs. I conducted a quick pat search for weapons and placed her in the rear seat of my patrol truck. I then stood by until other units arrived and took over the scene from there. The female was removed from my truck and placed in another units patrol truck. I cleared from the scene shortly after. NARRATIVE:

On 03/06/25, at approximately 1615 hours, while I was assigned to the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Criminal Interdiction Unit (CIU), we were advised by agents with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), as well as Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) that they witnessed packages from a suspect's vehicle entering a residence and they needed assistance with traffic stops leaving the house. We were advised by DEA and HSI agents that we could use their probable cause to stop vehicles and detain occupants of the vehicles. We just needed consent or other probable cause to search the vehicles and them.

There were other units assigned to the PCSD CIU that were around at that time. The first traffic stop which I assisted with, but did not conduct, was in the area of Kleindale Road and Howard Avenue on a red, newer model Toyota Tacoma that appeared to be a rental car; however, I was unsure. When I arrived on scene, there was only one occupant of the vehicle who was identified as Dale at a later time who was detained. I was advised that we could search the vehicle and I assisted in the search of the vehicle. When I searched the vehicle, I looked into anything that I could and did not find anything; however, the only thing I thought could have been something was a cloudy, crystal-like substance that clearly was not broken glass or plastic or anything that was on the front passenger seat floorboard, but it did not appear to be a usable amount of anything. The only thing it could have been based on my training and experience was possibly methamphetamine, but it was not enough to take a test for anything.

At that time, once I assisted in searching the vehicle, I then stood by. I retrieved an evidence bag after a search of the detainee was done and there was a glass tooter, or paraphernalia that had a burned on residue on the inside,

that came out of the detainee's pocket. I retrieved an evidence envelope from my vehicle and another person who conducted the search of the person put all the belongings from his pockets into that evidence envelope including the keys to the vehicle. I believe the probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted based on drug paraphernalia being in the detainee's pocket. I stood by as scene security as other deputies searched the vehicle after I did and they told me they found multiple loose blue pills marked M on one side and 30 on the other around the car. They were just loose. Once they were done searching the vehicle, since the detainee was not in my car and I did not have any of the evidence, I then went to set back up on the residence that the DEA and HSI agents were watching.

We were then advised that they needed a traffic stop in the area of Glenn Street and Campbell Avenue on a black Infiniti with a temporary license plate and no back bumper. I was not the first backup unit. I did not conduct the traffic stop; however, I responded anyway to assist in any way I could. I was advised when I arrived that there was only one occupant in the vehicle and he was detained. He stated that he had a small bag of cocaine in the car, but it was inside of the seats. Based on his admission to possessing a narcotic drug, a search of the vehicle was conducted. I was unable to locate any kind of way to get into the seat or anything like that and x-rays of the seat were done. I tried to look under the seat and I could not find anything. The rest of the vehicle was searched and I did not find anything when I assisted in searching the rest of the vehicle. At that time, I was advised that there was more vehicle traffic that needed to be pulled over from the house, so I left; however, at a later time I was told that a small baggie of a white, powdery substance, probably the cocaine, was found by the seat after I had left.

Once I got back into the area, I was told that a patrol deputy had assisted in a traffic stop that left the house in the area of Fort Lowell Road and Richey Boulevard on a silver Chevrolet Malibu. I arrived at that location and I was told that the traffic stop was conducted by Deputy J. M. Philpott #7611 and was assisted by Deputy J. Hershkowitz #9796. When I arrived at the traffic stop, they had one female detained and I saw the silver Chevrolet Malibu. It was bearing Arizona license plate # [REDACTED] which came back to [REDACTED] and I spoke with the female they had detained. She identified herself to me verbally as [REDACTED]

(DOB *****

Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she was leaving a friend's house named [REDACTED] or [REDACTED]. At that point, I asked the deputies who had initiated the stop if they had asked her any questions or read her her Miranda Rights and they said no. Detective R.

E. Coz #7530 was also at the stop and he was a canine handler for Canine Rikki. He conducted an open air sniff around the car and I was told that the dog alerted to the presence of a narcotic odor coming from the car. Once I verified that the dog alerted, I went back to my patrol vehicle which I put Ms. Robling in and read her her Miranda Rights verbatim from my Quick Reference card. Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she thought she would want a lawyer present while questions were being asked so I did not ask her anymore questions.

A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. I focused on the driver's side of the vehicle. Under the driver's seat was a piece of tin foil with a burned on residue and blue pills that appeared to have been melted or burned on it. I also searched a bag that was behind the driver's seat. The car was just full of stuff. I saw a lot of jewelry, a lot of personal effects, and a lot of mail that was to Ms. [REDACTED]; however, I searched the bag behind the driver's seat that was easily accessible by the driver and in that bag was another bag. I opened up that bag and I saw that there was a Ziploc style baggie with a large amount of pills. At a later time, I weighed the pills and it came back to approximately 14.04 grams without packaging which came out to about 140 pills roughly. There were also a lot of \$1 bills and a couple \$5 bills in a stack that was in the same pocket, and a broken glass pipe that had a burned on residue on the inside which I could also identify as drug paraphernalia.

The rest of the car was searched and I could not find anything else of evidentiary value so I grabbed an evidence bag from my patrol vehicle and put the items inside of it. We were then told by a nearby HSI agent that they were going to write a search warrant on the house, conduct it, and to hold all detainees until their tactical team could get ready and get the warrant written, signed, and approved by an assistant United States attorney (AUSA). I stood by for a long time while that process was working. Right before the process was working, I made the decision since we were not going to arrest the detainee, I possibly needed to help with be at the house. I told the female that her charges were going to be long-formed for Possession of a Narcotic Drug. I took her phones as evidence and told her that she was free to go.

Once Ms. [REDACTED] was let go, I was told that I probably was not needed at the search warrant so I transported all the evidence I had collected to the Foothills District substation where I filled out the Property and Evidence control form and weighed the drugs. The blue pills came out to approximately 14.04 grams and I could identify the pills as counterfeit Percocet pills based on my training and experience. These pills were oftentimes laced with Fentanyl. Once the evidence processing was completed by me, I then submitted all paperwork and put all the evidence in an evidence locker. Once all that was done, I then cleared from the call.

On 03/06/25, at approximately 1615 hours, while working for the Criminal Interdiction Unit, we responded to the vicinity of

upon request of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), who were conducting an investigation.

The DEA requested the assistance of the Criminal Interdiction Unit reference a possible traffic stop in this area, which they had been furthering their investigation. I was in contact with Agent Harreldon and Agent Elich. They advised of multiple vehicles leaving this property while conducting their investigation, and they requested we stop these vehicles reference their probable cause which they had for this investigation.

Multiple traffic stops were conducted. I arrived on a traffic stop conducted by Deputy J. M. Philpott #7611 near the intersection of Fort Lowell Road and Richey Boulevard. Once I arrived to this location I could see Agent Elich was on scene, and Deputy Philpott was also on scene with a female subject detained in the back of his patrol vehicle. The vehicle in question was a Chevrolet Malibu, and it was parked next to a liquor store.

I asked Deputy Philpott if he had requested consent to search the vehicle from the driver of the vehicle, in which he advised he did not. I then went and spoke with the female subject and requested consent to search the vehicle, which she denied.

I then went over to the female subject's vehicle and did a walk-around of the exterior to look for any hazards to myself or my Canine Partner, Rikki, which I would be utilizing for an exterior free-air sniff. As I walked around, the front passenger window was completely rolled down, and there was a great deal of items inside of the vehicle.

I then went to my patrol vehicle and gathered Rikki, who was a Narcotics Detection Canine, certified through the National Police Canine Association in the odors of methamphetamine, cocaine and heroin. Once Rikki was out of my patrol vehicle he relived himself, and I then brought him over to the Malibu. I gave him the search command, in which he began searching, working around the exterior of the vehicle, moving quickly, initially towards the end of the leash. Once Rikki came along the passenger's side, where the window was rolled down, I noticed his speed had slowed down, and he was closing his mouth, taking rapid

breaths through his nose, indicating to me he was having an odor response. Rikki kept his head and nose close to the vehicle while moving his body around, indicating a bracketing motion. Once Rikki and I were near the back portion of the passenger's side of the vehicle he continued to go onto his hind legs without any prompting him to detail this area. As he did this I could see him putting his nose close to the rear-door seam and taking rapid breaths through his nose.

I brought Rikki back around to the front of the vehicle after our initial passing, and made a back pass on the passenger's side, detailing various sections of the vehicle. As I was presenting near the front passenger door handle, Rikki then stood back up on his hind legs, reaching his nose and head into the vehicle, and stayed in that position momentarily, indicating to me again that he was responding to odor, as he stayed on his hind legs for an irregular amount of time. Rikki then moved back from the window and stood still, facing the vehicle, looking at the vehicle and back at me frantically; this indicated to me he was having difficulty pinpointing the source of the odor and to where it was directly inside of the vehicle, although he was able to indicate to the odor present at the passenger door. I presented at the open window, in which Rikki then stood up at the window, placing his head at the open window, then moved back from the vehicle, sitting down and facing the vehicle, looking frantically in my direction and then back towards the vehicle, and continued to lunge onto it.

At that point I determined there was probable cause to search the vehicle and all of the contents inside of it. I put Rikki back into my patrol vehicle, then went back and began to search the vehicle with Detective T. A. Dunn #8525 assisting me.

I began the search from the front passenger's seat. As I looked under the front passenger's seat I found foil with burnt residue, indicating to me this was paraphernalia. I secured that foil into an Evidence bag and later turned it over to Detective Dunn. Detective Dunn informed me he had located multiple Fentanyl pills in the back seat of the vehicle; please see his report for further information.

I later coordinated with Agent Elich, as they were still furthering their investigation and advising that they would be wanting to speak with the female subject potentially, and gathering a search warrant for the residence up the street, located at

Ultimately, they did not need to speak with the female subject. I explained to the female subject that the case would be long-formed to the Pima County

Attorney's Office, and she was then released from the traffic stop along with her vehicle.

I later went up to the address of

as the search warrant had been executed by the DEA and they requested I utilize my Canine Partner, Rikki, on a search of the interior of the residence, as it was a Narcotics search warrant.

I gathered Rikki from my patrol vehicle and brought him into the residence. As Rikki searched throughout the residence there was a bedroom, which was a single bedroom, single bath. As we were in the bedroom Rikki had continued to jump onto the bed, circle around and then took rapid breaths; although, he was unable to pinpoint exactly where any odor source was directly in that area.

At that point I relayed the information to Agent Elich, then put Rikki into my patrol vehicle. I stood by until no further assistance was needed, where I then left the area.

Upon setting up in the area, I further learned that the DEA was currently in the process of authoring a search warrant for the residence of

and that any vehicles that left out of there could be stopped based on their probable cause reference and ongoing investigation.

Just before 1644 hours, I was advised over the radio that a red Toyota Tacoma had departed and began travelling westbound. This was the direction of travel in which I was set on from the residence. A short time later, I observed it pass me. At approximately 1744 hours, I initiated a traffic stop at the intersection of Howard and Kleindale with California license plate # [REDACTED]. On the day of 03/06/25 at approximately 1615 hours, while assigned to the Criminal Interdiction Unit (CIU) of Pima County, in full uniform and a fully marked patrol vehicle, I was advised by Deputy R. E. Coz #7530 that he was on via telephone with a federal agency, which they developed probable cause for a stop on an Infiniti bearing Arizona temporary tag of # [REDACTED], and the vehicle was currently last seen traveling southbound on Fort Lowell Road and Campbell Avenue from a Speedway gas station.

I did observe the vehicle leaving the Speedway gas station, to which he did not have his lights on and it was after dusk, which I observed the vehicle traveling southbound on Campbell Avenue from Fort Lowell Road, which I conducted a traffic stop based on the probable cause from the federal agency that was working with Deputy Coz. Please see Deputy Coz's report for further clarification and details on the stop.

NARRATIVE:

On 03/06/25 while assigned to the CIU of Pima County, I was assisting a federal agency that was working a narcotics case from the residence of

At that time I was advised that a black Infiniti bearing Arizona temporary tag of # [REDACTED], the federal agents had probable cause to stop the vehicle. I observed the vehicle leaving a Speed gas station located at the cross streets on Fort Lowell Road and Campbell Avenue to which the vehicle did not have his lights on after dusk.

I was able to catch up to the vehicle to which I conducted a traffic stop with my overhead red and blue lights as well as chirped my siren. As I made my way up to the vehicle, I asked the male individual who was later identified as [REDACTED] to step out of the vehicle due to their investigation ongoing. As [REDACTED] exited the vehicle he stated to me he had cocaine in his vehicle to which I placed handcuffs on him to the rear with the double-lock mechanism engaged ensuring for tightness on [REDACTED] and I placed him in the back seat of my fully marked department-issued patrol vehicle.

I then stated to my backup units who arrived on scene, Detective Coz and a Border Patrol agent, Agent Rivera, that [REDACTED] stated he had cocaine located in his vehicle which gave us probable cause to search through his vehicle. [REDACTED] stated to me that the cocaine he hid inside his vehicle was hard to find and only he could find it to which he described to me that the cocaine was near his driver's side feet area and it was located underneath a frame of the doorstep entering the vehicle. We were then able to locate the cocaine that he stated he had to which it weighed 0.989 grams and tested positive for cocaine.

I advised the federal officers we were assisting on the case of the findings to which a federal agent came over and he finished the investigation reference our traffic stop and he had an interview with [REDACTED]. It was also noted that we had Border Patrol assistance to which they were assigned to our CIU and he stated to me that [REDACTED] currently had a notice in his records that he was undocumented and they would be filing paperwork on that behalf stating [REDACTED] was not a current citizen of the United States.

I then stood by as scene security until the federal agents stated [REDACTED] would be charged with ARS 13-3408A1, Possession of a Narcotic for the cocaine that was found and tested positive through our scanner system that our Border Patrol agents had on him. [REDACTED] was then transported over to the Pima County Adult Detention Center with no further incident.

He said his license had been suspended in Phoenix and he came about three months ago.

I then asked him if he was giving me the right date of birth again. He said yes. I asked him if he knew the last four of his Social Security Number (SSN), and he said [REDACTED]. I asked him if he knew his whole SSN. He said no, he did not. I asked him if he knew his driver's license number. He said no. I asked him if he had any identification on him.

I then informed him that it was very important for him to carry his identification with him, or some type of identification, because if something happened to him, it would be less hard for someone to identify who he was. He

said he lived on Swan and Valencia Road in some trailer, and he was getting his tire to where he lived because his car broke down.

I then asked him again if he was giving me the right information. Later, Deputy T. R. Bierman #9001 and Deputy S. K. Carter #9080 arrived, and they were helping me out, trying to identify the man. Deputy Bierman then informed me that he was able to find him on a federal look up, and in fact it had a picture, but it had a date of birth of

Initial Case Narrative by T. A. Dunn #8525 on 03/26/25 at 2308 hrs.

Total Dictation Time = 14:18 mins.

On 03/26/25 at approximately 1824 hours, while assigned to the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Criminal Interdiction Unit (CIU), we were working surveillance on a house near the area of Roger Road and Fairview Avenue with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), and they informed us that there was a gold vehicle leaving and that they would like a traffic stop on it.

I was able to observe the vehicle in the area of Prince Road and Oracle Road. The vehicle was in the number three lane set up for southbound on Oracle Road through Prince Road, and I saw that its front two tires were in front of the stop bar and the front bumper was obstructing the crosswalk.

At that point, once I saw the vehicle, I ran its license plate just to get some more information on it and see if the vehicle was currently registered or anything like that. I also informed my Communications Unit that I was going to conduct a traffic stop on that vehicle at that intersection, just south of by the cemetery.

Once the light was green and the vehicle left and it was through the intersection, I turned on my emergency overhead red and blue lights, my body worn camera, and my spotlight in order to initiate the traffic stop on the vehicle. The vehicle was bearing Arizona license plate # [REDACTED]. Since I ran it previously, I knew that license plate came back to the vehicle or a similar vehicle with an active registration and currently registered to [REDACTED], to an address in Rio Rico, Arizona. Before that, I also ran the registered owner of the vehicle for a records check, Mr. [REDACTED], and I saw that he did not have any active warrants out for his arrest and that he had a current Arizona driver's license.

When I pulled the vehicle over, it pulled over on the north entrance to a Catholic cemetery that was just south of Prince Road and Oracle Road. Once I approached the driver of the vehicle, I saw that it was the same driver as the registered owner. At that point, I identified myself as law enforcement and told Mr. [REDACTED] the reason for the traffic stop. I told him that he was stopped past the stop bar, and I then asked him for his current driver's license, his current registration for the vehicle, and his proof of insurance for the vehicle. Mr. [REDACTED] was able to provide all that information to me. I also had a look around the vehicle to begin with and when I was up there, I did not see anything in plain view that was concerning to me. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] while I was up there if he had any weapons or drugs in the car, and he said no.

There was a slight language barrier, he spoke very broken English and I spoke very broken Spanish, but he was able to understand the majority of what I was saying and I was able to understand a minimal amount of what he was saying.

I went back to my vehicle to see if there was anything that I had missed when I ran it previously, and then went back out to the car. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] consent to search the car, and he said no. At that point, I asked a narcotics detection canine who was working the area to respond to my traffic stop location, Detective R. E. Coz #7530. At that point, I asked Mr. [REDACTED] to step out of the vehicle and due to the nature of what we were working, I did a Terry frisk on him, searched his belt line for any weapons and his pant legs for any weapons, not manipulating any clothing, and then brought him back to my vehicle where I then started a written warning.

I was speaking with Mr. [REDACTED] and told him that this was not a ticket, there were no fines or court dates involved in this, it was just a written warning. I tried to tell him in Spanish that it was only a warning by saying: solamente un advertencia; and it appeared that he understood what was going on. While I was speaking with Mr. [REDACTED] and filling out the form, I had trouble getting a current address for him; however, at a later time during an interview with a Spanish-speaking person, he said that he is illiterate, he does not know how to read but he knows how to get to where he is going by landmarks.

While I was writing in the warning, Detective Coz showed up with his canine partner, Rikki, and they conducted an open air sniff of the vehicle. I was then told by Detective Coz after that the dog alerted to the presence of a narcotic odor. A few moments later, while I was still filling out the warning, I was told by my backup deputy, Detective G. J. Hernandez #8690, that we were good to put him in handcuffs. At that point, I grabbed control of Mr. [REDACTED] right hand, put it behind his back, and he was secured into handcuffs, checking for tightness and ensuring the double-lock mechanism was engaged; we had to use two pairs of handcuffs. At that point, I then asked Mr. [REDACTED] to sit in the back seat of my car, and he was able to get in there okay.

At that point, I muted my body worn camera and made sure my doors were closed and locked, and assisted in the search. I was told by Detective Coz that once he opened the engine compartment, there were a couple things out of place. There was one black canister that was circular that would open up, and that thing was full of small individual bags of a white powdery substance. There was also a blue ball that had some kind of card in there that I opened up and then put back where I saw it at a later time. I finished helping search the vehicle. I found a brown notebook that had directions or a timeframe of how long it takes to drive

from Tucson to Oklahoma, as well as from Tucson to somewhere else but I did not know where it was. To me, it appeared that this was a ledger to me. There were also multiple other random names and phone numbers on miscellaneous papers that were found in the vehicle, that I took as well since they might be evidence of a ledger. We did not find anything else besides what was in the engine compartment as far as evidence goes, besides that we took his cell phone as evidence as well.

At that point, we were joined by one of the DEA agents who would interview him, as well as a Border Patrol agent who was cross-deputized and assigned to the PCSD CIU, Agent Rivera, who assisted in the interview; however, I was told that after the agent read Mr. [REDACTED] his Miranda Rights, that Mr. [REDACTED] asked for a lawyer to be present and no other questions were asked of him. At that point, the DEA said that they just wanted him charged, they were not going to take it.

At that point, I knew that we were probably going to tow the car, so I asked my Communications to start a tow truck to our location, and I began to start on the paperwork. While I was filling out the paperwork, Mr. [REDACTED] said that he wanted to get a few phone numbers from his phone, as well as call somebody to come pick up the car; however, his phone was not working. He said that he knows a trick to turn on the screen; however, the trick that he was explaining was not working; therefore, we continued to have the tow truck come to our location and tried explaining his phone was broken and could not get phone numbers out of it.

I handed everything that needed to be placed into Evidence to Detective J. McNeely #5805, who also showed up to the stop at a later time, and he was able to take all the items of evidentiary value. I took other things that we would need for the jail, I took his driver's license, wallet, and he had some jewelry we could not get off of him at the stop, and put that in a separate bag.

A few moments later, the tow truck driver arrived from Mobile Maintenance and Towing (MM&T). I finished the Vehicle Removal Report (VRR) and e-mailed it to the Vehicle Impound Unit, Terminal Operations, as well as the MM&T dispatch.

Once the tow truck driver arrived and towed the vehicle away, I transported Mr. [REDACTED] to the Pima County Jail where he would be booked in on Possession of Narcotic Drug for Sale, a Class 2 Felony. I completed the felony interim and submitted it to the booking staff. Once I got to the jail without incident, I finished the booking process.

I took a few items of jewelry that he was able to get off at the jail, as well as a necklace and a hat he had on with him at the jail, took that and put it into the San Xavier substation in for safekeeping. Once the booking process was

complete and I went to the San Xavier substation to put his property in as safekeeping, I completed the property and evidence form and submitted the property.

At that point, I cleared the call.

On 03/26/25, at approximately 1818 hours, Detective T. A. Dunn #8525 had conducted a traffic stop near the intersection of West Prince Road and North Oracle Road. I began traveling that direction, where shortly after, at approximately 1821 hours, Detective Dunn had requested for me via the radio.

I responded to the traffic stop and was there approximately one minute later at 1822 hours. Upon arrival, I could see that the vehicle was pulled over on the shoulder of the road next to the southbound lane on North Oracle Road, next to an entrance to a cemetery. Detective G. J. Hernandez #8690 was also on scene with Detective Dunn.

As I was arriving on scene, I could see that Detective Dunn was speaking with the driver, and he was stepping out of the vehicle and walking back to Detective Dunn's patrol vehicle. Detective Dunn requested that I utilize my canine partner, Rikki, in a free air sniff, and advised that the driver had denied consent to a search of the vehicle.

I noted that the driver's door was left open and asked Detective Hernandez to close the door. I went around the vehicle, which I noticed was a gold Toyota Camry. As I looked inside the vehicle from the outside, I did not see other occupants, and I did not see any hazards to my canine partner. I went back to my patrol vehicle, where I got Rikki, who is a narcotics detection canine certified through the National Police Canine Association (NPCA) in the areas of heroin, cocaine, and methamphetamine.

I got him out of my patrol vehicle and walked him over to the plants which were directly next to my car and allowed him to relieve himself. As I checked the direction of the wind, I noticed that the wind was traveling in a southern direction, which would be leading from the rear of the Camry to the front of the Camry.

I brought Rikki along to the front of the car, where I began searching. Immediately, Rikki moved quickly up to the front hood and grill portion of the Camry and slowed down. Rikki was moving back and forth bracketing, showing a change of body posture and a change of breathing. I noted that he was closing his mouth, and he was putting his nose directly against the grill to the point where his nose was pressing to the side momentarily, as he could not get any closer to the grill. Rikki was clearly having an odor response and was moving around the front bumper going lower, and then back up to the grill. I also had

noted that besides the wind pushing our direction, that the vehicle was still on, indicating to me that there would be an air flow being shoved multiple directions out of the engine compartment from the compartment in the engine bay.

Rikki ultimately moved back from the grill, where he stood still, was facing the vehicle, and then sat down as a trained common response alerting to the vehicle. I brought Rikki back to my patrol vehicle and had him sit. I then put him in the back of the car. I indicated to Detective Dunn that Rikki had alerted to the vehicle, and went back over to the car to begin searching along with Detective Hernandez.

Due to the odor response and location, I requested that Detective Hernandez pop the hood of the vehicle. As he did, I opened the hood. As I looked around, I noted that there was a black container, which was not an ordinary component which would be in the engine bay in the front, driver's side portion of the engine bay. As I removed the lid, I noticed that there were multiple plastic baggies and a plastic baggie with a white substance fell out from the container. I placed it back and put the lid back, where I had advised Detective Hernandez to detain the driver.

I had taken pictures of the container and its location of which where I had found it, exteriors of the vehicle, and portions of the interior of the vehicle. Detective Hernandez had also placed the narcotics from the container along the back trunk of the vehicle, where I took a picture of that and later submitted the pictures into Axon. At this point in time, no further assistance was needed, and I the cleared from the traffic stop.

Upon arrival at the location, I asked Deputy Dunn if there was anything I could do to help with his investigation. He requested that I take custody of the evidence reference this case and transport it to the Foothills District Office to be processed as evidence.

At this time I received an evidence bag from Deputy Dunn that contained a black cylinder container which he further explained had multiple packages of cocaine inside of it, along with a ledger and two separate paper documents that had other names and phone numbers, or ledger type information, on them. In addition to this, he also provided me with a black Samsung cell phone with a red case that belonged to the arrestee reference this matter.

I took possession of all these items in the evidence bag and transported them up to the Foothills District Office where they were processed into Evidence.

NOTE: The cocaine was weighed with packaging. Also on the exterior of each package of cocaine there was a label indicating the weight of the cocaine it contained. Based on my training and experience, I know these to be consistent with the sales of narcotics due to the fact that the number 7, 14, and 28 were on many of these bags. This would be consistent with a quarter ounce, half ounce and a full ounce of cocaine.

Once the items were processed into Evidence and placed in Locker #007, this concluded my involvement in this incident.

Since no probable cause existed at this time, they were released without incident.

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT:

On 04/23/25, a traffic stop was conducted in Pima County for a Title 28 violation. Mr. [REDACTED] was the driver and sole occupant of the vehicle. Mr. [REDACTED] gave consent to search the vehicle. A gray bag was located, hidden behind a panel in the dashboard left of the steering wheel. In this gray bag were individual but similarly packaged small bags of powdery substance that had multiple colors. Some bags were white, some were blue, some were pink, and some were yellow. A field test of the substances was conducted and was presumptive positive for cocaine hydrochloride.

After a search incident to arrest, three other similarly packaged bags of a white, powdery substance were located in his front-right coin pocket of his pants. These were also tested, and tested positive for cocaine hydrochloride.

In the gray bag, a total of 33 bags were located. A total weight of all of the bags was 64.25 grams. This was a for-sale amount.

NARRATIVE:

On 04/23/25 at approximately 1242 hours, while riding as a two-person field training unit with Deputy A. Valdez #9942, I was assigned to the Pima County

Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Criminal Interdiction Unit.

Deputy Valdez and I were in the area of Speedway and Interstate 10 when I saw a black Hyundai Elantra with Arizona license plate # [REDACTED] violate ARS 28-754B, stating a signal of intention to turn right or left when required should be given continuously during, not less than, the last 100 feet traveled by the vehicle before turning.

This vehicle initially was traveling westbound on Speedway, west of Interstate 10, but intended to make an eastbound U-turn near West Speedway Boulevard and North Columbus Avenue. Once this vehicle made a U-turn, I initiated a traffic stop on it after I saw the violation by turning on my overhead red and blue emergency lights, and I advised my Communications Unit over the radio that I would be initiating a traffic stop on this vehicle. The vehicle continued to travel eastbound on Speedway, passing Riverside, and eventually even turned southbound to get on the frontage road for Interstate 10 eastbound, before the vehicle finally pulled over to the right-hand side of the roadway.

When the vehicle finally stopped, I got out of my patrol vehicle and approached the driver from the driver's side once he rolled down his window. After I saw that he rolled down his window, I approached the vehicle and asked the driver to roll down the rear window. At that point, I saw that he probably did not understand my English. I told him la ventana and made a signal to roll it down, and he did so. I did not see anything back there at the time.

I introduced myself and asked the driver for his registration, proof of insurance, and his driver's license, in Spanish. In Spanish, I asked him: Para licencia y registro y seguro de auto, por favor. At that point, he provided me with some kind of Mexican identification card out of Sinaloa.

Once I was handed this, Border Patrol Agent Moreno, who was a cross-deputized task force officer assigned to the PCSD Criminal Interdiction Unit, responded to my traffic stop as a backup unit. He went to me, and I showed him the driver's identification card. He said okay.

I then went back to the driver and asked him if I could speak with him outside of the vehicle. However, since I had very limited Spanish-speaking abilities, and I knew that Border Patrol Agent Moreno spoke Spanish very well, Border Patrol Agent Moreno took over asking the driver questions.

I observed the driver step out of the vehicle, and Border Patrol Agent Moreno put the driver into handcuffs. Border Patrol Agent Moreno walked the driver back to Border Patrol Agent Moreno's patrol vehicle and said we had consent to search

the vehicle. At that point, I assisted Border Patrol Agent Moreno in placing the driver in the back of the patrol vehicle and standing by as he did a quick pat-down search of the driver.

Border Patrol Agent Moreno, Deputy Valdez, and I then went back to the vehicle, and I began to search it with Deputy Valdez as well as Border Patrol Agent Moreno. Once we began searching, we were also joined by Border Patrol Agent Rivera, who was also a cross-deputized task force officer assigned to the Criminal Interdiction Unit.

Border Patrol Agent Moreno was searching the front driver's side when he said: I got it. I looked to where Border Patrol Agent Moreno was, and it appeared there was a panel off of the dashboard left of the steering column that had a gray bag in it with multiple colors. I went to look at this bag, and there were multiple bags of white, powdery substances that were all similarly packaged. Some of them were different colors, though; some of them were blue, white, pink, and yellow. I saw this, and I saw Border Patrol Agent Rivera get out his field drug testing device called a Genesis. At a later time, he said one of the bags tested positive for cocaine hydrochloride.

After this, I asked Deputy Valdez to take pictures of the vehicle, as well as where the drugs were located while the drugs were still in there (so that was before that), and to take pictures of the driver.

Seeing that there were a lot of bags in this gray bag, knowing it was a for-sale amount, just due to the fact that they were similarly packaged, approximately the same size, and there were a lot of them, as well as them being hidden behind a panel in the dashboard, I made an advisory to Sergeant J. Butcher #5510, who was a detective sergeant with PCSD, but was assigned to the Counter Narcotics Alliance (CNA). He said he would send two detectives out to conduct an investigation.

After a while, two detectives from CNA showed up, but wanted to move everything to a separate location, just due to the number of people who were gathering around us and recording us. Before units on scene left though, I did a search incident to arrest on Mr. [REDACTED]. We did not ask him any questions. He was read his Miranda Rights by one of the Border Patrol agents, but we were told that he: Lawyered up.

Units on scene searched Mr. [REDACTED] incident to arrest, and three other bags that were similarly packaged (one was significantly smaller than the other two) of the same white, powdery substance were in the front-right pocket of his jeans in the little coin pocket. These were removed and taken as evidence. At a

later time, they also tested positive for a Narco Test for cocaine.

Once units on scene were sure that all of the evidence was gathered, we also saw that there was a large amount of United States currency in Mr. [REDACTED] back pocket. This was counted in front of him. The amount that was in his back pocket was \$649. There was also his wallet, which was near the center console of his vehicle, and it also had a large amount of United States currency. This was also counted in front of him. The amount in the wallet was \$1,568. In the center console, where it would be lifted up and there would be a little compartment, were three \$2 bills. These were also counted, collected, and put in with the money with his wallet.

Two phones were located in the center console. These were taken as evidence. Behind the front passenger's seat, on the backside of it where there would have been a little storage net where magazines or something could be put in, was an aerosol canister. This was inspected by other units on scene, and it appeared to have been some kind of trap device to store something. There was nothing inside of it, but we opened it up on the bottom side. The bottom could be taken off. It would be glued onto the lid of a bottle, it could be unscrewed, and there would have been a little compartment inside. This was taken as evidence as well.

After everything was taken as evidence, units on scene placed it in my patrol vehicle. We took the arrestee as well as the evidence to the Tucson Police Department's (TPD) epic station off of Park and Fair. Once we got there, we were let in by the TPD detectives who showed up, and I gave them the information. They took custody of the vehicle and all of the evidence. I told them the circumstances of the contact, and they said they had TPD Case #2504239502.

After all of the evidence was given to them, units then transported the arrestee, Mr. [REDACTED] to the Pima County Jail, where he was booked in on the charge of Possession of a Narcotic Drug. I filled out the felony interim and submitted it to booking staff.

NOTE: During the traffic stop, before units had left the scene, a Border Patrol gave us a detainer to give to the booking staff. When we booked him and we filled out the interim and gave that to the booking staff, we also gave them the detainer.

I, Deputy A. Valdez #9942, was patrolling in a two-man patrol unit with Detective T. A. Dunn #8525 assigned to the Pima County Sheriff's Department (PCSD) Criminal Interdiction Unit.

Detective Dunn and I were driving through Speedway, heading westbound, when we observed a Title 28 violation, which was ARS 28-754, a turning violation, on a black Hyundai. The vehicle then made a U-turn, traveling eastbound, and immediately failed to pull over, but eventually pulled over on the frontage road of Interstate 10 and Speedway, traveling southbound.

While Detective Dunn and I conducted a traffic stop, I approached the vehicle from the passenger's side while Detective Dunn took lead in the traffic stop. The driver was later identified as [REDACTED]. When we approached the vehicle and spoke to [REDACTED], it was clear he spoke Spanish. Detective Dunn asked him if he spoke any English, and [REDACTED] stated no. Detective Dunn then spoke to [REDACTED] with as much Spanish as he possibly could, but luckily, a deputized Border Patrol agent assigned to the PCSD Criminal Interdiction Unit responded as our backup. It was Agent Moreno.

Agent Moreno took over speaking with [REDACTED], requesting for [REDACTED] to exit the vehicle. At the time, when Jose exited the vehicle, Border Patrol Agent Moreno detained him, putting him into handcuffs, and told us that we had the consent to search the vehicle.

I assisted with searching the vehicle, searching the front-right passenger's side, the seat, only the front part of the vehicle. I searched the glove box, which was already open from [REDACTED] grabbing his registration. While we were

searching the vehicle, Border Patrol Agent Moreno found a different-colored powdery substance that was stuffed into the dashboard. It was in a gray bag. The powdery substance was pulled out and field-tested on the spot by Border Patrol Agent Rivera, who also responded as a backup unit. When he field-tested it, it came back positive for cocaine.

At that time, I began taking photographs of the vehicle, of the inside and outside, the VIN, and the license plate, which were uploaded to Axon.

██████ was placed in the back of the Border Patrol Unit and was later searched in a search incident to arrest. They found three more individual bags of cocaine in his coin pocket from his pants. I collected the evidence and stored it in Detective Dunn's patrol vehicle. The evidence was later transferred to the Tucson Police Department (TPD) epic station. In correlation to that, the case number was #2504239502.

Detective Dunn and I then booked Jose into the Pima County Sheriff's Adult Detention Complex and charged him with ARS 13-3408A2, Possession of Narcotics to Sell, which was a Class 2 Felony. After booking ██████ into the jail, we returned to the San Xavier District Office, in which we put J ██████ hat, watch, and necklace into Safekeeping.

On November 19, 2025, I was notified there was a discrepancy in the amount of currency documented between Detective Dunn and other detectives. Based on that, I watched Detective Dunn's body camera video to see if I could ascertain the correct amount. After reviewing the body camera, the correct amount of currency found was \$552 and \$1468.

At 58:06, Detective Dunn goes from \$380 to \$500 when it should have been \$400 which would have brought the total to \$549 in that wade of cash rather than \$649. Moreover, there was \$3 taken from the center console which he did not include in any of his totals. Adding the \$3 to the \$549 would be \$552.

At 01:02:18, Detective Dunn goes from \$800 to \$1000 when it should have been \$900. Therefore, the second wade of cash would have equaled \$1468.

This concludes my involvement. NFI.
